This event aims to raise awareness about the importance of rabies prevention and commemorate the groundbreaking work of Louis Pasteur, who developed the first rabies vaccine in 1885. World Rabies Day is observed globally every year on September 28th, highlighting the significance of rabies prevention worldwide.

Rabies, identified by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) as one of the deadliest infectious disease on the planet, is entirely preventable through vaccination. The City of Great Falls Animal Shelter is committed to making rabies vaccinations accessible to all pet owners in the community as part of their efforts to promote public health.
