Here is my previous email: Public works inspection fees are being set by a small group of developers, designers, contractors. It looks like the compromise will effectively keep out the small developers/contractors/designers due to the excessive fees (percentage wise for the small cost projects). The small developers/contractors/designers can become large if they are not priced out of the process. Thereby increasing competition. Which will put pressure on large contractor/developers/designers to keep price charged to city low. By keeping the small cost job percentage high the large contractors/developers/designers have, probably unknowingly, kept the small and hungry developer/contractor/designer out of the process.

The pub works hrly inspection rate increase is too low. In the industry the hourly bill charged for a drafter was \$160 about 10 yrs ago.
