I understand the concern some Great Falls residents and city government individuals have. We have all witnessed the growth in various recreational vehicles and equipment being parked on the city roadways. I am not opposed to the city of Great Falls becoming more active in monitoring and controlling the time that large RV's, Travel Trailers and utility trailers. I am concerned that the ordinance 3230 being discussed by the City Commission will adversely affect a large number of Great Falls residents who own various RV's, Travel Trailers, utility trailers and related items.

I have witnessed an ordinance even more extreme than this being implemented in the City of Torrance, California. While visiting in the South Bay area, the City of Torrance essentially banned any RV/Travel Trailer from being parked on a city street within the city limits overnight. This also included RV repair and sales outlets. While it created issues for those RV/TT owners who had homes in Torrance, other cities surrounding Torrance had a more liberal approach and allowed those items to be parked on a street/roadway per the standard time allowed for parking. I would trust that we, who live in such a marvelous outdoor-accessible state, would not be as confined in our access to our RV/Travel trailer or other trailer as those living in a major metropolitan area such as Torrance, California. However, the proposed ordinance, as written would be nearly as draconian as that in a major California metropolitan area.

As an owner of a number of RV's and trailers, I am opposed to several parts of the proposed ordinance, but specifically, the 36 hour time limit to "load/unload". To expect a household that is "loading or unloading" an RV or Travel Trailer to be able to complete the process in 36 hours is too short a time frame for either process. Part of that 36 hour time limit would involve some/all of the individuals either being at work, school or sleeping. To expect that all "loading or unloading" would be accomplished within that time frame is extremely wishful thinking and unlikely to be achievable by the vast majority of "recreational vehicle," "utility trailer" and "vessel;" owners.

The ordinance also apparently will not allow an owner to make any modifications, cleaning, or even minor service or repairs on the equipment as the time allowed is so limited. I understand that most people would intimate that no service or repairs should be completed "on the street". While very little work of that nature is likely accomplished "on the street", many owners would likely work on the equipment on their property, but need to park the equipment "on the street" when it is not being actively serviced or repaired. The time limit would quickly expire in the owner's attempt to complete even minor servicing or repairs.

Therefore, I would strongly advocate that the proposed ordinance maintain the state/city time frame of 48 and 72 hours and 5 days as outlined in current city and state codes and ordinances.

The proposed ordinance contains, according to city staff:

- New definitions for a class of vehicles designated as "recreational vehicle," "utility trailer" and "vessel;"
- A new provision that only allows such vehicles to be temporarily parked in a residential district
  for the limited purpose of loading and unloading, with that "temporary" period being no more
  than 36 hours in any 7 day period;

If the vehicle appears to be otherwise legal and operable, volunteers can place an orange sticker on the vehicle as a gentle reminder of the city and state rules that prohibit parking on city streets for more than 72 hours.

Montana Code Annotated 61-8-356 states: "no vehicle shall be parked or left standing upon the right of way of any pubic highway for a period longer than 48 hours, or upon a city street or any state, county or city property for a period longer than five days."

That rule also applies to recreational vehicles and boats.

It is not illegal to park RVs on city streets but they must be moved every 72 hours.

GFPD does get complaints about RVs and boats, but those typically come into compliance by moving, Ehrke said.

If a vehicle isn't moved after receiving an orange sticker, volunteers can come back and place a green sticker notifying the owner that the vehicle has been classified as junk or abandoned. The registered owner can receive a \$20 citation.

At that point, a letter is sent to the registered owner and if the issue isn't addressed within 10 days of the date the letter is mailed, GFPD can tow the vehicle.
