





Director Faulkner discussed the MANG aircraft transition with the departure of the F-15's and also the FedEx 727 which quit flying approximately 18 months ago. He noted the noise contours have shrunk dramatically. Also, from the military component, the number of operations at the airport have increased approximately three times.

Director Faulkner reported the Chamber of Commerce put together a fund using donations from individuals and businesses in the community to assist in getting Frontier Airlines to come to Great Falls. When the other carriers began to offer T fares to compete with Frontier, planes filled up. Frontier used the fund one month, but paid it back when they made so much money. The entirety of the money is still intact. He noted a presentation is being prepared to talk to a different low-cost carrier about some flights in 2016, and the fund would be used as a guarantee. This time Chicago is being looked at as the connecting city. Since Great Falls does not have service to Chicago, a federal grant can be written which could pick up 50-60% of the cost.

Mayor Winters questioned the possible expansion of flights for the parcel industry. Director Faulkner responded FedEx has added an additional flight. He noted parcel traffic comes through Great Falls, but mail traffic goes through Billings. He believes that a reevaluation may achieve a cost savings if the mail traffic is returned to Great Falls. He also discussed a possible growth opportunity to clear customs for some Canadian flights, with no waiting.

Commissioner Bronson requested copies of the slides be provided to the Commission. Director Faulkner responded there are additional slides that show the route network of all the low-cost carriers that are active in the United States.

## 3. QUARTERLY BUDGET UPDATE

Fiscal Services Director Melissa Kinzler provided and discussed a handout for FY  $2015 - 3^{rd}$  Quarter Review, including a highlight sheet.

Director Kinzler noted that 17% is only a minimum goal to maintain during shortages of revenue to cover expenses.

City Manager Greg Doyon commented that the City has recovered very well considering everything the City went through financially. Looking ahead, he noted the needs of the City and priorities that must be evaluated with the future revenue picture. The City has had a financial reset and will be heading accordingly with a new vision and a new way of looking at revenues and priorities City-wide. Challenges have been deferred and there are still hard issues to deal with some of our facilities.

Manager Doyon discussed the Charter calculation changing the methodology used to determine bundle packages vs. user accounts, resulting in a reduced franchise fee to the City. He has questioned what Charter uses to measure Great Falls cable subscribers, but has not received any information. There may be areas that have been annexed but have not been added to Charter's franchise map.

Director Kinzler reviewed an additional PERA contribution the City has had to pay, in the amount of \$157,062.07, for Fire Acting Pay due to a clerical error from 1990 until a few months ago.

Manager Doyon noted the Golf fund owes the General Fund over \$1 Million, and the Commission may be asked to write that off at some point also.

# 4. <u>DISCUSSION OF POTENTIAL UPCOMING WORK SESSION TOPICS</u>

Manager Doyon reported the City's non-voted general obligation debt capacity for the Commission to address certain equipment and capital items is approximately \$2 Million. An outline of a state program with very low interest that could be used to start replacing fire equipment will be brought before the Commission at the May 5, 2015, Work Session.

Manager Doyon also discussed the upcoming budget review and the beginning of a recalculation method for determining internal service charges.

There being no further discussion, Mayor Winters adjourned the informal work session of April 21, 2015, at 6:28 p.m.
