CALL TO ORDER: 4:00 p.m.

CITY COMMISSION MEMBERS PRESENT: Bob Kelly, Bill Bronson, Bob Jones, Tracy Houck and Fred Burow.

CITY STAFF PRESENT: City Manager; City Attorney; Directors of Fiscal Services, Public Works, and Planning and Community Development; Executive Director of the Housing Authority; DES Emergency Manager; Fire Chief; Police Chief; and, the City Clerk.

COUNTY COMMISSION MEMBERS PRESENT: James Larson and Jane Weber. Commissioner Joe Briggs was excused.

COUNTY STAFF PRESENT: DES Coordinator.

Also present was Megan Syner, National Weather Service Warning Coordination Meteorologist.

1. VINEYARD FIRE AND FLOODING EVENT AFTER ACTION REPORTS

Fire Chief Steve Hester, County DES Coordinator Vince Kolar, City DES Manager Dave Nordel, National Weather Service Warning Coordination Meteorologist Megan Syner, and Public Works Director Jim Rearden reviewed and discussed the attached PowerPoint presentation that included:

- Discussion and after action report regarding the Vineyard fire
- Communication Interoperability Work Group
- Briefing and discussion regarding the flooding event (first flash flood on record in Great Falls)
- Briefing and discussion regarding the State Preparedness Report
- Discussion and update of the Pre-Disaster Mitigation Plan

Commissioner Houck inquired what enforcement action was available if citizens knowingly and purposely disregard a CodeRed alert to avoid a certain area so that emergency workers can respond to a crises area efficiently.

Chief Bowen responded that there are statutes in place if a person disobeys an order of a police officer directly, not indirectly like the CodeRed process. People saw the black smoke and flocked to the area to see what was going on. The problem is the logistics of trying to identify everyone coming into the area to determine if they have legitimate business and then determine

whether or not to take enforcement action. Emergency personnel are busy just trying to keep people out of the area to create lanes of traffic for people to evacuate.

DES Manager Nordel added that there hasn't been a major event in Great Falls for about 54 years. When you don't have that it becomes a spectator sport and a public safety issue.

2. PUBLIC COMMENT

Richard Liebert, 289 Boston Coulee Road, commended the City and County for its long range planning. He inquired about a contingency plan for a refinery incident at Calumet.

Ron Gessaman, 1006 36th Avenue NE, commented he was not pleased with the CodeRed notices to evacuate. He also suggested developers be required to provide fire breaks at new subdivisions.

In response to Mr. Liebert, Chief Hester reported that Calumet has foam trucks and a fire brigade inside the confines of the refinery to take care of itself. Great Falls Fire trains weekly with the fire brigade at Calumet.

In response to Mr. Gessaman, DES Manager Nordel commented that was the first time CodeRed was used to send out mass messages. The messages were too long and went out to the entire city. They have since talked with representatives of CodeRed as well as participated in more training. They can now send alert messages out to just a portion of the city. It was a learning experience, and it has helped make the system better.

Commissioner Houck left the meeting at 5:31 p.m.

After discussion, appreciation was expressed to City/County emergency personnel. It was suggested that they build an exercise around a summer event like the Vineyard fire; that Planning and Community Development provide input concerning whether the City should be doing something different with regard to annexations, zonings and developments in the periphery; that the Fire Department go out into the rural areas and stage with other entities, work on interoperability, and participate as much as possible to get training at real events; that the City look into getting a brush truck; and, that staff provide an update annually to the City/County Commissions at a joint meeting.

ADJOURN

There being no further discussion, Mayor Kelly adjourned the informal joint work session of October 17, 2016 at 5:44 p.m.

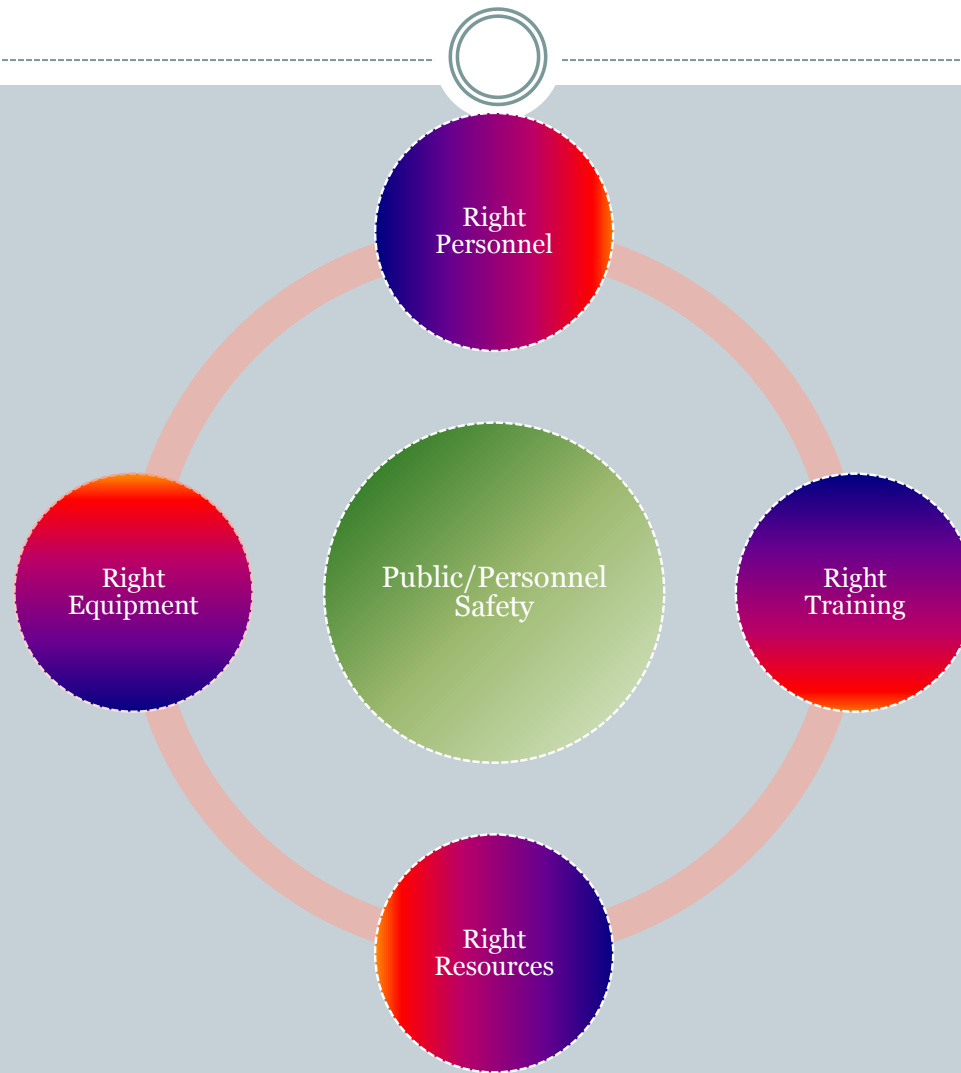

Vineyard Fire Observations



- Observation; GFFR and Rural Fire had difficulty communicating resulting in weakened command structure.
 - Possible Solution; ICS training & exercise. Joint Command Structure and Cascade County Standard Command Guide.
 - Possible Solution; Incident Command at Incident Command Post ICS training & exercise.
- Observation; Some resources were not requested and utilized.
 - Montana Mutual Aid Identify operational need before request is made
 - Non-firefighter resources Utilize farm resource when available and safe to handle livestock.
 - Resources released to early must get better information prior to strategic decisions like the weather forecast
 - Media with firefighters Pre-season Fire/Media meeting. Discuss PPE requirement
 - Traffic control Coordinate resource request with Law Enforcement

Vineyard Fire Observations



- **Observation: GFPD computers and cell phone wouldn't work due to provider limitations.**
 - Possible Solution: Contact Verizon provider to determine problem and solutions
- **Observation: County DES assigned Fire Warden duties on the fire and could not staff the EOC no County Commissioners at the EOC**
 - Possible Solution: County DES and Cascade County Commissioners on the EOC call list and notified immediately when the EOC is activated. County DES needs an alternate if he is to work on wildland fires.
- **Observation: Communications for shelter opening are not formalized.**
 - Possible Solution: Change checklist at dispatch
- **Observation: GFFR apparatus are not designed for wildland fires creating greater risk to firefighters**
 - Possible Solution: Acquire type 6 Engine that allow pump and roll, and all wheel drive to efficiently attack the fire
- **Observation: Agency to Agency Communications were not interoperable**
 - Possible Solution: Establish SOP, program radios, and establish a communication plan. Train first responders on proper inter-agency communication
- **Observation: Fire Hydrants were inoperative adjacent to new construction.**
 - Possible Solution: Work with Community Development and Public Works to ensure hydrants are operational during building construction phase.

Vineyard Fire Observations



- **Observation:** Homeowners turned on sprinklers causing loss of water pressure
 - Possible solution: Educate Community on wildland defensible space and water conservation
- **Observation:** Public Works heavy equipment operators working directly on the fire had no basic wildland training
 - Possible solution : Obtain training
- **Observation:** Use of Code-RED mass notification system didn't work as well as intended.
 - Possible solution : Train PIO on proper use of Code Red
- **Observation:** CCSO had no EOC Representative
 - Possible solution : Updated the EOC notification checklists with approval of all agencies.
- **Observation:** Providing critical incident/situational information out to the public was delayed
 - Possible solution : PIO needs standardized press procedures Training/SOP. Establish social media outlets
City/County needs emergencies notification and information
- **Observation:** City Dept. Representatives were not sure of his or her role at the EOC.
 - Possible solution; Develop and Approve Internal checklists for each dept that prioritized and chronicle duties and responsibilities
- **Observation:** The EOC infrastructure needs to be updated and more robust
 - Possible solution : Design and fund EOC improvements that will make the facility efficient and effective

August Flooding Event



- Rainfall amounts: 2.5 to 3.5 inches in downtown Great Falls within one hour
- Greatest 1-hour rainfall: 1.13 inches, June 20, 1991 (Exceeded this value on August 9, 2016)
- Greatest 30-minute rainfall and last occurrence of intense rain: 1.04 inches, July 14, 2012 with 0.66 inches falling within a 15-minute period
- Significant flooding impacts to downtown Great Falls

State Preparedness Report



- **Required annually**
 - LEPC function
 - 164 page document
 - Compiled at the state and sent to FEMA nationally
- **First report was accomplished in 2015**
 - Sent to CC DES/CoGF late
 - Accomplished only by the two Emergency Managers
- **2016 report submitted 30 Sept to State DES**
 - Full LEPC participation
 - 11 mandatory areas to be addressed
 - Selected 4 optional areas
 - ✦ Access Control
 - ✦ Cyber-security
 - ✦ Operational Communications
 - ✦ Mass Care
- **Scale of 1-5 scoring/Ratings 0-20%/21-40%/41-60%/61-80%/81-100%**
- **Brief by exception ratings lower than 3 will have gaps identified**
