Item: Rural Fire Departments Memorandum of Understanding (MOU)

Action Requested: Approve MOU with Rural Fire Departments

Suggested Motion:

1. Commissioner moves:

"I move that the City Commission (approve/deny) the Memorandum of Understanding ("MOU") between the City of Great Falls and the four (4) adjacent Cascade County Rural Fire Departments".

2. Mayor calls for a second, discussion, inquiries from the public, and calls for the vote.

Staff Recommendation: Approve the MOU.

Background:

There has been much discussion on the use of City fire hydrants by Rural Fire Departments. We believe it is in the best interest of our community and surrounding areas if we can work together on this matter. Public Works, GFFR and Great Falls City Attorney and Cascade County Legal Department, along with input from the Cascade County Commission, drafted this MOU. The four Cascade County Rural Fire Departments involved in this MOU are as follows: Gore Hill, Vaughn-Manchester, Sand Coulee and Black Eagle.

The MOU requires the following:

- Rural Fire Departments personnel will be trained by designated City personnel on the proper operation and maintenance of the City fire hydrants.
- The Rural Fire Departments will bear sole liability for damages and/or injuries that may occur from their use of the City fire hydrants (private property, personal injury, etc.)

- Damages that may occur to the City fire hydrants and/or the City distribution system as a result of the Rural Fire Departments' use of the City fire hydrants shall be the sole responsibility of the Rural Fire Departments.
- Any and all apparatus that may connect to the City fire hydrants shall be equipped with approved back-flow preventers. Backflow preventers will be approved by designated Utility personnel.
- The Rural Fire Departments will use the City hydrants only on an emergency basis and will not use the City hydrants to routinely fill tanks/trucks. The Rural Fire Departments will not use the City hydrants for their own training purpose, without first receiving the approval from the City's Public Works Director, or his designee.
- The term of this MOU is for the period of three (3) years, unless terminated in accordance with Section 12 of the MOU.

Concurrences:

Developed in conjunction with GFFR and the Cascade County Commissioners. Reviewed by the City Attorney and Cascade County Legal Staff.

Fiscal Impact:

No fees are being charged to the Rural Fire Departments as part of this MOU.

Alternatives:

The City Commission could vote to deny the MOU.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

This Memorandum of Understanding (hereinafter, "MOU") is hereby entered into this _____ day of _____, 2010 by the City of Great Falls (hereinafter, the "City"), and the Black Eagle Rural Fire Department, the Gore Hill Rural Fire Department, the Sand Coulee Rural Fire Department and the Vaughn-Manchester Rural Fire Department, (hereinafter, the "Rural Fire Departments").

WHEREAS, the Rural Fire Departments may have the need to utilize the City fire hydrants during emergencies outside the City limits; and

WHEREAS, the Rural Fire Departments have utilized the City fire hydrants in past practices without a written agreement with the City,

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual obligations, agreements and covenants contained herein, the City and the Rural Fire Departments agree as follows:

- 1. Rural Fire Departments personnel will be trained by designated City personnel on the proper operation and maintenance of the City fire hydrants.
- 2. The Rural Fire Departments will bear sole liability for damages and/or injuries that may occur from their use of the City fire hydrants (private property, personal injury, etc.)
- 3. The Rural Fire Departments release the City from liability and hold the City harmless from any tortious or negligent act on the part of Rural Fire Departments resulting from the Rural Fire Departments' acts.
- 4. The City has the right, at all times during the term of this MOU, through its agents and employees, to examine and inspect the same to determine whether the Rural Fire Departments have complied with its obligations hereunder with respect to the care and maintenance of the City hydrants.
- 5. Damages that may occur to the City fire hydrants and/or the City distribution system as a result of the Rural Fire Departments' use of the City fire hydrants shall be the sole responsibility of the Rural Fire Departments.
- 6. Any and all apparatus that may connect to the City fire hydrants shall be equipped with approved back-flow preventers. Backflow preventers will be approved by designated Utility personnel.
- 7. The Rural Fire Departments will notify the Cascade County Consolidated Dispatch before they open and/or close the City fire hydrants. Further, the Rural Fire Department will call 406.727.8045 on the next business day (Monday through Friday, 0800 1630) to notify the City Public Works of the location, duration of use and any problems that may have been experienced with the City

- fire hydrant. At which time designated City personnel will conduct an inspection of the City fire hydrant in question to determine if there exists any damage.
- 8. The Rural Fire Departments will use the City hydrants only on an emergency basis and will not use the City hydrants to fill tanks/trucks. The Rural Fire Departments will not use the City hydrants for their own training, without first receiving the approval from the City's Public Works Director, or his designee.
- 9. The parties to this MOU agree that the City will monitor the City fire hydrants' use by the Rural Fire Departments and the City will monitor the frequency of use by the Rural Fire Departments. The Rural Fire Departments will take full responsibility for any actions on their part that could lead to abuses or violations of the terms and conditions of this MOU.
- 10. Because there are a number of fire hydrants within the City limits that are privately owned, the Rural Fire Departments must obtain permission from the owners for use of the private hydrants.
- 11. The term of this MOU is for the period of three (3) years, unless terminated in accordance with Section 12 below. This MOU will become effective upon the Effective Date, as set forth above.
- 12. The City or Rural Fire Departments may voluntarily terminate this MOU prior to the three year term, without indicating their reasons for termination, by serving written notice to the other Party no later than thirty (30) days prior to the termination. The City may terminate this MOU without prior notice in the event of the Rural Fire Department's breach of any of the terms and conditions of this MOU.
- 13. Notices by the City and the Rural Fire Departments may be given by means of electronic mail, fax or by conventional mail. All notices must be sent to the signatories listed below.
- 14. This MOU may not be altered, modified or amended, except in writing.

 This MOU must be properly executed by an authorized representative of the City and of the Rural Fire Departments.
- 15. This MOU constitutes the entire agreement between the City and the Rural Fire Departments relating to the subject matter hereof.

IN WITNESSWHEREOF, the City and the Rural Fire Departments have caused this MOU to be signed by duly authorized officers or representatives of the City and of the Rural Fire Departments, each by its proper officers thereunto duly authorized by their respective governing bodies.

Staff Recommendation: Staff recommends that the City Commission approve the bid award for one new 2010 Cold Milling Machine to Tractor & Equipment Co. of Great Falls for \$294,700.

Background:

Significant Impacts

The current cold milling machine is an Ingersoll Rand Milling Machine, MW-250-C purchased in 1992. This piece of equipment is powered by a Detroit diesel engine and has a milling width of 32 inches wide. Parts are no longer available for this piece of equipment. Ingersoll Rand does not produce this milling machine any longer and has not for several years.

Purpose

This unit will be used in the Street Division. The 2010 Caterpillar PM 102 cold milling machine is powered by a Cat C7 225 HP diesel engine. The milling width of this unit is 39 inches wide, the industry standard for this class of machine, which is traditionally utilized in urban maintenance programs. The primary function of the cold milling machine unit will be to provide pavement preservation maintenance, specifically transition and taper milling prior to asphalt overlays. The milling machine is necessary to properly complete routine asphalt overlays. Typically, about 60 miles of overlays are performed by the Street Division annually. The old

unit has continually had maintenance problems. It has been out of service routinely over the past two seasons, which disrupts the annual street maintenance program.

Evaluation and Selection Process

The specifications were advertised two times in the Great Falls Tribune, placed on the City of Great Falls website, and mailed to five prospective bidders. The bids were opened on January 5, 2011 with two bidders responding. Tractor & Equipment Co. had one bid and Modern Machinery had two bids. The low bid from Modern Machinery did not meet bid specifications.

The bid from Tractor & Equipment Co. did not offer a trade-in allowance for the 1992 Ingersoll Rand Milling Machine, MW-250-C, VIN # 5106-S. This old milling machine will be sold at a later date.

Conclusion

The bid by Tractor & Equipment Co. of Great Falls meets specifications for the cold milling machine.

Fiscal Impact: Funds for this purchase are provided for in the FY 2011 Central Garage Budget.

The extra width of the milling machine will increase production by the Street Division and reduce the unit cost of milling as shown below.

Existing mill width = 32 inches 865 SY Daily Production Average \$3.09/SY Replacement mill width = 39 inches 1,021 SY Daily Production Average \$2.62/SY

Annual average SY with existing mill: 51,900 SY Annual average SY with new mill: 61,242 SY

Since there is only one contractor in the City that has a mill, it is imperative that the City have its own mill. This was illustrated in a 2009 presentation to the City Commission. In cost comparisons utilizing the 2005 to 2009 MDOT and City of Great Falls contracted bid cost averages, a local contractors milling prices average \$6.02/SY or \$3.40/SY higher than City costs to perform the same work. At that price differential, a payback analysis is as follows:

Contracted Milling \$6.02/SY x 61,242 SY = \$368,677 City Cost to Mill \$2.62/SY x 61,242 SY = \$160,454

Savings by Street Division Milling = \$208,223 Cost of new milling machine = \$294,700 Payback = 1.42 years

Alternatives: Reject the bids for the purchase of one new 2010 cold milling machine.

Staff Recommendation: Staff recommends that the City Commission approve the bid award for six new 2011 police pursuit vehicles to Whiteside Chevrolet of St. Clairsville, Ohio for \$126,000.

Background:

Workload Impacts

The purchase of six new police pursuit vehicles is made each year. These vehicles are kept in police pursuit for four years, which places the odometer at 90,000 - 100,000 at the end of the four years.

Purpose

These units will be used by the Police Department.

Evaluation and Selection Process

The specifications were advertised two times in the Great Falls Tribune, placed on the City of Great Falls website, and mailed to five prospective bidders. The bids were opened on December 22, 2010 with three bidders responding. The six police pursuit vehicles being replaced will be sold at a later date.

The bid award was postponed by the City commission on January 4, 2011 to allow staff additional time to review the bids.

Conclusion

The bid by Whiteside Chevrolet of St. Clairsville, Ohio meets specifications for the police pursuit vehicles. These units will have a pre-delivery inspection (PDI) at the Whiteside Chevrolet dealership, be loaded and shipped F.O.B to the City of Great Falls Public Works Complex.

Fiscal Impact: The purchase price for six new police pursuit vehicles during FY 10-11 was \$130,385. The total bid price difference from last year is a decrease of \$4,385 or -3.34% less. Funds for this scheduled purchase from the ERS (Equipment Revolving Schedule) were provided in the FY 2011 Central Garage Budget.

Alternatives: Reject the bids for the purchase of six new 2011 police pursuit vehicles.

Suggested Motion:

"I move that the City Commission (accept/deny) Ordinance 3063 on first reading and set a public hearing for February 1, 2011."

2. Mayor calls for a second, discussion, inquiries from the public, and calls the vote.

Staff Recommendation: Staff recommends that the City Commission accept Ordinance 3063 on first reading and set a public hearing for the Amendment of Title 15, Chapter 5, pertaining to the International Property Maintenance Code for February 1, 2011.

Background: The International Property Maintenance Code (IPMC) governs condition and maintenance of all existing properties, buildings and structures to insure they are safe, sanitary and fit for occupation and use. The City of Great Falls Building Safety Division is proposing to adopt the new 2009 IPMC, which replaces the 2003 edition.

City Commissions in the past have questioned the necessity of the City holding public hearings to adopt new edition building codes adopted by the State, given that the State mandates adoption by local governments. The State agreed that it was a redundant process and has allowed, by administrative rule, that local governments may adopt the latest codes by administrative action.

On Friday, October 15, 2010, the City's Building Official adopted by administrative action the new building codes adopted by State on July 29, 2010 (within the allowable 90-day window). Those new codes included the 2009 International Building Code, the 2009 International Existing Building Code, the 2009 Uniform Plumbing Code, the 2009 International Mechanical Code, the 2009 International Fuel Gas Code, the 2008 National Electrical Code and the 2009 International Energy Conservation Code.

However, the IPMC, established by the International Code Council (ICC) is not adopted by the State of Montana. It is necessary for the City to hold a public hearing and adopt Ordinance 3063 in order to adopt the new edition IPMC, so that the specific edition (2009) may be referenced and exceptions to certain IPMC subsections be maintained where those provisions duplicate existing City Codes, are not applicable or where terms are inaccurate (see Exhibit A).

Regardless of whether building codes are adopted administratively or by ordinance, the Building Safety Division is proactive in terms of advising the development community when new codes will be adopted and become effective, and to discuss changes reflected in the new codes. This is achieved via the Building Safety Division's quarterly newsletter, our website, in handouts at the permit counter, etc.

Concurrences: N/A

Fiscal Impact: Adopting the 2009 International Property Maintenance Code will update standards for condition and maintenance of properties in the city and allow for code enforcement action where warranted. This has benefit to the City in terms of maintaining properties and property values within the City of Great Falls.

Alternatives: The City Commission may or may not adopt Ordinance 3063.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE OFFICIAL CODE OF THE CITY OF GREAT FALLS (OCCGF), TITLE 15 CHAPTER 5, PERTAINING TO THE INTERNATIONAL PROPERTY MAINTENANCE CODE

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF GREAT FALLS, MONTANA:

- Section 1. That Title 15, Chapter 5, Section 010 of the Official Code of the City of Great Falls (OCCGF) pertaining to the International Property Maintenance Code be amended as depicted in Exhibit "A" attached hereto, which removes any language indicated by a strike-out and adds any language which is bolded; and,
- Section 2. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect thirty (30) days after second reading and final adoption by the City Commission.

Copies may be obtained from the International Code Council, 4051 West Flossmoor Road, Country Club Hills, IL 60478 or their web site www.iccsafe.org.

- F. Subsection 302.4 Weeds. Shall read as follows: "All premises and exterior property shall be maintained free from weeds or plant growth in excess of eight (8") inches. All noxious weeds shall be prohibited. Weeds shall be defined as all grasses, annual plants and vegetation, other than trees or shrubs provided; however, this term shall not include cultivated flowers and gardens." Second paragraph is deleted. Deleted. Deleted.
- G. Subsection 302.8 Motor Vehicles. Deleted.
- H. Subsection 304.14 Insect Screens. Specify time period of May 1st to October 1st.
- I. Subsection 505.1 General. Strike reference to the "International Plumbing Code" and replace with "Uniform Plumbing Code."
- J. Subsection 602.2 Residential occupancies. Shall read as follows: Dwellings shall be provided with heating facilities capable of maintaining a room temperature of 68°F (20°C) in all habitable rooms, bathrooms and toilet rooms. Cooking appliances shall not be used to provide space heating to meet the requirements of this section.
- K. Subsection 602.3 Heat supply. Every owner and operator of any building who rents, leases or lets one or more dwelling unit, rooming unit, dormitory or guestroom on terms, either expressed or implied, to furnish heat to the occupants thereof shall supply heat to maintain a temperature of not less than 68°F (20°C) in all habitable rooms, bathrooms, and toilet rooms. Exception #1 is deleted. (Ord. 3063, 2011; Ord. 2874, 2004; Ord, 2864, 2003; Ord. 2748, 1998; Ord. 2710 Exh. A), 1996; Ord. 2651 (Exh. B), 1993; Ord. 2627 §1(Exh B) 1992; Ord. 2538 §2(Exh. Background: At the December 1, 2010, agenda setting session, the Mayor expressed his desire for the City of Great Falls to have an official flag as a symbol of pride for the community. At its December 15 and 29, 2010, agenda setting sessions, the City Commission discussed the design for an official flag and requested staff to research the matter. It was determined that the logo would be used as it captures major elements of Great Falls, including the falls, the buffalo skull representing Charlie Russell, Lewis & Clark, Square Butte, strip farming, the big sky, the railroad tracks and, at one time, the smokestack.

The Official Flag of the City of Great Falls will be displayed in the Commission Chambers. Additionally, replicas of the flag may be used by elected officials and City staff for purposes of representing and publicizing the City of Great Falls in city-related events.

Fiscal Impact: The cost for the design of a City of Great Falls flag and accessories is approximately \$400. The City Clerk's Office is in receipt of an anonymous donation in the amount of \$300 for costs specific to the creation of an official flag.

Alternatives: The City Commission could deny Ordinance 3064.

ORDINANCE 3064

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF GREAT FALLS AMENDING TITLE 1, CHAPTER 4 OF THE OFFICIAL CODE OF THE CITY OF GREAT FALLS BY ADDING SECTION 045 TITLED "CITY FLAG"

WHEREAS, the City Commission expressed its desire for the City of Great Falls to have an official flag of the City of Great Falls; and

WHEREAS, the logo was implemented after the Great Falls City Centennial Commission held a competition in 1982-1984 among graphic artists. The logo captures major elements of Great Falls, including the falls, the buffalo skull representing Charlie Russell, Lewis & Clark, Square Butte, strip farming, the big sky, the railroad tracks and, at one time, the smokestack. As the community was involved in the creation of the logo, it was determined the logo be the design on an official City of Great Falls flag as a display of pride of our community; and

WHEREAS, an official flag of the City of Great Falls shall be displayed in the Commission Chambers; and

WHEREAS, replicas of the official flag of the City of Great Falls may be used by elected officials and City staff for purposes of representing and publicizing the City of Great Falls in city-related events.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF GREAT FALLS, MONTANA:

Section 1. That Title 1, Chapter 4 of the Official Code of the City of Great Falls be amended by adding Section 045 titled "CITY FLAG." The full text and provisions of which are set forth in Exhibit A, attached hereto and, by this reference, made a part hereof.

Section 2. <u>EFFECTIVE DATE</u>. This ordinance shall be effective 30 days after second reading and final adoption.

1.4.010 Form of government

The form of government is "commission-manager" established by charter with self-governing powers. (Ord. 2642 §(part), 1993).

1.4.020 Definitions

Unless otherwise specified or a different meaning is plainly intended, the following definitions apply throughout this code:

"Board of Appeals" hereinafter referred to as the Board of Adjustment.

"City" means the City of Great Falls, Montana, or the area within the territorial limits of the City of Great Falls, Montana, and such territory outside of the City over which the City has jurisdiction or control by virtue of any constitutional or statutory provision.

"Computation of time" means the time within which an act is to be done. It shall be computed by excluding the first day and including the last day; and if the last day is a Sunday or a legal holiday, that day shall be excluded.

"Commission" means the City Commission of the City of Great Falls, Montana. "All its members" or "all Commissioners" means the total number of Commissioners provided by the general laws of the State of Montana.

"County" means the County of Cascade, Montana.

"Law" denotes applicable federal law, the constitution and statutes of the State of Montana, the Ordinances of the City of Great Falls, and when appropriate, any and all rules and regulations which may be promulgated thereunder.

"Manager" means City Manager.

"May" is permissive.

"Month" means a calendar month.

"Must" and "shall" are mandatory.

"Oath" shall be construed to include an affirmation or declaration in all cases in which, by law, an affirmation may be substituted for an oath, and in such cases the words "swear" and "sworn" shall be equivalent to the words "affirm" and "affirmed."

"Ordinance" means a law of the City; provided that a temporary or special law, administrative action, order or directive, may be in the form of a resolution.

"Owner" applied to a building or land includes any single owner, joint owner or tenant in common, of the whole or a part of such building or land.

"Person" means natural person, joint venture, joint stock company, partnership, association, club, company, corporation, business, trust, organization, or the manager, lessee, agent, servant, officer or employee of any of them.

"Personal property" includes money, goods, chattels, things in action and evidences of debt.

"Preceding" and "following" mean next before and next after, respectively.

"Property" includes real and personal property.

"Real property" includes lands, tenements and hereditament.

"Sidewalk" means that portion of a street between the curbline and the adjacent property line intended for the use of pedestrians.

"State" means the State of Montana.

"Street" includes all streets, highways, avenues, lanes, alleys, courts, places, squares, curbs, or other public ways in this City which have been or may hereafter be dedicated and open to public use, or such other public property so designated in any law of the State.

"Tenant" and "occupant," applied to a building or land, includes any person who occupies whole or a part of such building or land, whether alone or with others.

"Title of Office." Use of the title of any officer, employee, department, board or Commission means that officer, employee, department, board or commission of the City.

"Written" includes printed, typewritten, mimeographed or multigraphed.

"Year" means a calendar year.

All words and phrases shall be construed and understood according to the common and approved usage of the language; but technical words and phrases and such others as may have acquired a peculiar and appropriate meaning in the law shall be construed and understood according to such peculiar and appropriate meaning. (Ord. 2642 §(part), 1993).

1.4.030 City limits

The corporate limits of the City shall be as shown on the official City map, which map shall be on file in the Department of Public Works at all times. (Ord. 2642 § (part), 1993; Prior code §1-3-1).

1.4.040 City seal

The corporate seal of the City shall be circular in form with inner and outer circles of rope design. The outer circle shall be one and three-fourths inches in diameter, and the inner circle shall be one and one-fourth inches in diameter. It shall bear upon the upper portion of the space between the inner and outer circles the words, "City of Great Falls" and upon the lower portion of the space the word, "Montana." Upon the upper portion of the space within the inner circle shall be the word, "Seal" and upon the lower portion of the space the inscription, "Incorporated 1888." All lettering shall be in gothic style type. Within the inner circle shall also be a replica of a waterfall. (Ord. 2642 §(part), 1993; Prior code §1-4-1).

1.4.045 City flag

A. Official Flag. The flag hereafter described is adopted as the Official Flag of the City of Great Falls for the purpose of display in the Commission Chambers. Replicas of the Official Flag of the City of Great Falls may be used by elected officials and City staff for representing and publicizing purposes in City-related events.

B. Description. On the background of white shall appear the logo of the City of Great Falls surrounded by a blue border. (Ord. 3064, 2011).

1.4.050 Official flower

The "iris" is designated and shall be the official flower of the City. (Ord. 2642 §(part), 1993; Prior code §1-12-1).

1.4.055 Naming and renaming city parks

- A. Naming a park. To name a city park the following procedure shall be used.
 - 1. Each park shall be named upon adoption of a resolution by the City Commission. The City Commission shall conduct a public hearing prior to the consideration of the park naming resolution.
 - 2. When developing names for a park the Neighborhood Council in the district where the park is located may review a list of options submitted by the Park and Recreation staff in order to make a recommendation to the Park and Recreation Board. The Park and Recreation Board may use the input of the Neighborhood Council and any interested citizens when making a recommendation to the City Commission.
- B. Changing the name of park. To change a name of a park the following procedure shall be used:
 - 1. A written request for a park name change shall be submitted to the Park and Recreation Director.
 - 2. The Park and Recreation Director shall meet with the appropriate Neighborhood Council to discuss the requested name change and receive a recommendation from them to take to the Park and Recreation Board.
 - 3. The Park and Recreation Board shall make a recommendation to the City Commission based on, but not limited to, the following:
 - a. Justification/rationale for change
 - b. Appropriateness of the proposed name
 - c. Amount of support for the change
 - 4. The park name may be changed upon adoption of a resolution by the City Commission. The City Commission shall conduct a public hearing on the resolution changing the name of the park.
- C. Park names in memory, dedication or in honor of an individual or group. Parks named in memory, dedication, or in honor of an individual will only be done if that person has made a significant contribution toward the development of that specific park or in some way has made a notable contribution to the City, State or Nation. In order for a park to be named after a group, club, or organization, that entity must have made a major financial or service contribution toward the development of that specific park. (Ord. 2770, 2000)

1.4.060 Publication of ordinances

Except as otherwise specified, an ordinance shall contain only one comprehensive subject clearly expressed in its title and shall be posted in three conspicuous places within the City, as the governing body shall direct and prescribe. (Ord. 2642 § (part), 1993; Ord. 1903 §2(part), 1976).

1.4.070 General penalty

- A. Except as otherwise specified, any person convicted of a violation of any section of this code shall be fined a sum not to exceed five hundred dollars or incarcerated for a period not to exceed six months, or both. (Ord. 2642 § (part), 1993; Ord. 1902 §2(part), 1976)
- B. Any person convicted of a violation of any section of this code, where any duty is prescribed or obligation imposed, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor. A separate offense shall be deemed committed upon each day such duty or obligation remains unperformed or such act continues, unless otherwise specifically provided in this code. (Ord. 2642 § (part), 1993; Ord. 1902 § (part), 1976).

There will be no charge for electronic copies of documents other than staff time (staff time will be charged only if it takes more than 30 minutes to compile/complete the research).

RESOLUTION NO. 9913

A RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING PROCEDURES AND A FEE SCHEDULE FOR COPIES AND RESEARCH OF PUBLIC RECORDS

WHEREAS, members of the public and organizations often request copies of public documents and information from the City of Great Falls; and,

WHEREAS, government information may be inspected and copied by the public pursuant to Article II, Section 9 of the Montana Constitution, and § 2-6-102, MCA; and,

WHEREAS, the costs in providing these services include, but are not limited to, paper, copier supplies, maintenance costs, and staff time; and,

WHEREAS, to meet the demands of public record requests, establishment of procedures will provide consistent protocol within City Departments.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Commission of the City of Great Falls that the following procedures and fees be applied in responding to requests for public records:

- 1. All non-routine public record requests shall be made through the City Clerk's Office.
- 2. Record Request forms are to be completed for any non-routine public records (material prepared in the regular course of City business not prepared for mass distribution) that are pulled for review or copying. The form serves three functions: (1) to give the City a comprehensive understanding of the types of information being requested; (2) to be able to contact the requester if a request cannot be filled right away; and, (3) to provide a receipt for monies collected.
- 3. Records will be provided in the form they exist, allowing the requester to compile the data in their own format.
- 4. Any request, which does not refer to an "identifiable" public record, shall not be processed until the requester provides further information.
- 5. To maintain the integrity and security of City records, an hourly fee will be charged for City staff supervision of requester's examination of public records.
- 6. The City Clerk's Office shall be the office of record for completed records request forms.

CALL TO ORDER: 7:00 PM

MOMENT OF SILENCE

ROLL CALL: City Commissioners present: Michael J. Winters, Robert Jones, Bill Bronson, Mary Jolley and Fred Burow. Also present were the City Manager, Deputy City Manager, City Attorney, Directors of Library, Park and Recreation, Planning and Community Development, Public Works, Acting Director of Fiscal Services, Executive Director of the Housing Authority, Fire Chief, Police Chief and the City Clerk.

NEIGHBORHOOD COUNCILS

1. MISCELLANEOUS REPORTS AND ANNOUNCEMENTS.

There were no miscellaneous reports or announcements from neighborhood council representatives.

BOARDS & COMMISSIONS

2. <u>MISCELLANEOUS REPORTS AND ANNOUNCEMENTS.</u>

There were no miscellaneous reports or announcements from representatives of Boards and Commissions.

PUBLIC HEARINGS

OLD BUSINESS

NEW BUSINESS

CDBG Policies and Citizens Participation Plan reaffirmed, and the 2011/2012 CDBG funding priorities set.

3. <u>2011/2012 COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT</u> (CDBG) POLICIES AND FUNDING PRIORITIES.

Planning and Community Development Director Mike Haynes reported that this item is to set 2011/2012 CDBG percentage funding allocations that will provide the Community Development Council (CDC) with parameters for funding before the CDC hears requests to fund specific projects and programs next month. Mr. Haynes emphasized that there are no guarantees that the 112th Congress will maintain funding levels for CDBG programs. Despite that uncertainty, there are two known quantities with regard to expenditures: (1) the City Commission voted to commit the final \$332,000 of the \$1 million committed to the Upper Lower River Road Water and Sewer District, leaving no funding available for other public facility or infrastructure projects; and (2) Mr. Haynes expressed the importance of 20% of funding being set aside for administration of the CDBG program if

City staff is to continue to administer the program effectively, meeting the rigorous federal requirements for Consolidated Plans and Annual Action Plans, the CDC funding allocation process, project administration, monitoring, reporting and auditing.

He explained that last fiscal year the 20% CDBG administration charge equated to \$195,600. Overhead and expenses, including support functions, fiscal services, building maintenance, insurance, vehicle and equipment leases, computers and IT services, printing, publishing, etc., accounted for over \$70,000. Salaries and benefits for 2.5 FTE to administer the CDBG program, three revolving loan programs and fair housing program were over \$138,000. Administrative funds remaining at the end of the fiscal year go to eligible projects and programs.

Mr. Haynes requested that the City Commission support the suggested motion in the agenda report that refers to the funding priorities in Exhibit E, with clarification that, regardless of the funds received, administration be held at 20% which is needed to administer the CDBG-supported programs and other federal funds these staff have secured. He concluded that this action tonight is to provide direction to the CDC. Final funding decisions will be made by the City Commission in April, 2011.

Commissioner Jolley moved, seconded by Commissioner Jones, that the City Commission reaffirm the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) policies, reaffirm the Citizen Participation Plan, and set the 2011/2012 CDBG funding priorities as shown in Exhibit E attached to the agenda report.

Mayor Winters asked if there was any discussion amongst the Commissioners.

Commissioner Burow inquired the status of Brett Doney's prior request to have limitations removed from the 5% economic development allocation, rather than those funds being restricted to the loan fund.

Commissioner Jones inquired if Mr. Doney would first go before the CDC to request flexibility on the 5% economic development allocation.

Commissioner Bronson commented that the agenda report sets forth the types of activities economic development funds may be used for. It doesn't contain restrictions on the types of activities Mr. Doney had expressed concerns about.

Mr. Haynes responded that the Great Falls Development Authority (GFDA) will be going before the CDC with its request. The CDC will consider requests that are eligible under HUD regulations as far as economic development is concerned.

Mayor Winters asked if there were any inquiries from the public.

Cyndi Baker, 500 Montana Avenue NW, expressed concern about the 20% of CDBG funding proposed for administration. Ms. Baker read comments Mr. Doney made at the Community Needs hearing. She encouraged the Commission to consider Mr. Doney's suggestions, and for the Commission to do fewer bigger projects to save on administrative costs. Ms. Baker inquired who the City gets its economic advice from.

Commissioner Bronson responded that the City is a participant in the Great Falls Development Authority. Commissioners Burow and Bronson sit on the Board of Directors of the GFDA, and that he sits on the Executive Committee of the GFDA.

Ms. Baker commented that she does not feel 5% for economic development is appropriate. She feels that percentage should be increased by taking a percentage amount from Planning and Administration and Affordable Housing.

Commissioner Burow agreed with Ms. Baker.

Commissioner Jolley commented that she doesn't feel the money is being wasted on Planning and Administration. There are 2.5 employees that do those jobs, and there are internal service charges. She pointed out that a few years ago there was no money for economic development. This program is community development block grants – federal money. Everyone pays taxes. It goes to the federal government. It comes back to local governments because of the needs of the community. This community has great housing needs, especially for people with disabilities. She doesn't believe the administrative cost is too high in this instance to comply with the federal paperwork.

Brett Doney, Great Falls Development Authority, residing at 3048 Delmar Drive, commented that the City and the GFDA are strong partners. The GFDA appreciates the City's support of a broad range of economic development efforts. He expressed that the Community Development Council is being underutilized as a resource to the City Commission. He also noted that the City's Housing Rehab Specialist is fully funded out of the affordable housing's 27 percent. Mr. Doney discussed the public facility's percentage going towards the Upper Lower River Road project. He commented that this year the City is funding just that one project versus last year's 12 public facility's projects. He noted that similar sized cities manage to administer their CDBG programs in full compliance with HUD at 10%-15% for administration. He suggested reducing the administrative cost from 20% - 17½%. He concluded that GFDA's biggest priority will be technical assistance to businesses.

Commissioner Bronson moved, seconded by Commissioner Burow, that the main motion be amended to reaffirm the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) policies, reaffirm the Citizen Participation Plan and set the 2011/2012 CDBG funding priorities as follows:

Affordable Housing – 27% Administration – maximum of 17.5% Public Service Activities – 15% Economic Development – 7.5%

Commissioner Bronson explained that, prior to Mr. Doney's suggestion, he was considering an amendment to bring the administration costs down to 15% and put that 5% into the economic development column. This is the fourth time he has had the opportunity to be involved in the CDBG allocations. During that time it has been recognized that the administrative expense could be high at times. But, at the end of the year the Commission typically does not have to allocate all of the monies to administrative that were set forth in the initial funding priorities. He believes it is time to instruct staff to sharpen their pencils and keep to the 17.5% or lower and boost the amount given to economic development, recognizing that GFDA may not be the only applicant for those monies. He believes the Commission needs to make a statement that it is behind economic development in this community. Commissioner Bronson concluded that he believes that this adjustment in administration to economic development gives the Commission an opportunity to put more dollars in a practical program as opposed to an administration cost.

With regard to the amendment, Commissioner Jolley inquired how much money was left over from administration from the last Community Development Block Grant.

Mr. Haynes responded there was nothing left over. The expenses exceeded the income last year, and will do so this year at 20%. It will be made up from the general fund, or an employee will have to be cut.

Commissioner Jolley commented that she was happier when economic development was funded by other ways, not with Community Development Block Grants. She doesn't think money is being wasted on Planning and Administration.

Commissioner Jones commented that he would like to see the process move forward before changing allocations to economic development. He was concerned about Mr. Haynes' comment that the entire amount was spent last year, and noted that staff does an outstanding job administering this amount of funds. He was not in favor of the amendment.

City Manager Greg Doyon inquired if the allocations were set in stone tonight, or as the applications are submitted, would staff be better able to tailor what the administration costs will be when the allocation amount is known the fall

Mr. Haynes responded that the purpose of setting the funding priorities tonight is to give direction to the CDC. The final action will not be taken by the City Commission until April. He understands the urge to be more efficient, but the only efficiency he can see would be to cut a job to make those numbers work.

Mr. Doyon explained that when the Planning and Community Development departments were merged this past year, there were issues with the allocations. To tap into the general fund could potentially be problematic if the Commission wants to keep the current staffing.

The Commission is setting parameters tonight. Mr. Doyon suggested giving Director Haynes an opportunity to provide more detail of what it is going to cost to administer what the City thinks it may receive. At a minimum, he wants the Commission to understand what the impact may potentially be.

Commissioner Bronson commented that he was not suggesting that staff was wasting any time or expenses. He is concerned that 20% is being requested for administration when there are two other critical component programs that are being recommended at 15% and 5%. He believes it is legitimate for this body to raise the question regarding 20% for administrative costs when, in some prior years, it didn't ultimately amount to the proposed amount. Commissioner Bronson asked if the program couldn't be run at the allocations he suggested.

Mr. Haynes responded that the funds for CDBG administration do much more than administer the CDBG funds received each year. The CDBG administration pays for 100% of the City's housing rehab specialist who is responsible for three revolving loan programs totaling \$2.4 million dollars. Those are self sustaining funds that bring in about \$350,000 per year, and about the same is expended per year. The reality is that is outside what another municipality may or may not be doing. It also pays for 50% of the City's Fair Housing advocate. He plays an important role in many housing issues within the City. In reality, the staff actually administering the CDBG funds that are coming in and going through the CDC, works out to about one full-time employee. The remainder is funding the other programs, which other communities do not have.

Commissioner Bronson inquired if the Commission was bound by the percentages set tonight, or if the percentages could be revised prior to the final action

Mr. Haynes responded that the City Commission is setting guidelines tonight. His concern is that staff will be going through this process based on a best case scenario of receiving the same amount of funding as last year.

Chances are less could be received. The CDC needs these parameters to work with as they hear requests to fund projects and programs. If 17.5% is committed for administration when that is not feasible, then the CDC will be making a recommendation for dollars that the City won't have in April, 2011.

Mayor Winters commented that tonight the Commission was setting a guideline. After receiving additional figures from Mr. Haynes, the percentages can be adjusted at that point.

Commissioner Jolley commented that the CDC will be looking at funding priorities and the percentages will turn into dollar amounts. She suggested the original funding percentages as set forth in the main motion and Exhibit E.

Commissioner Burow noted he was in favor of the amendment to save money, be more efficient, and use that money is a more productive way.

Amended Motion failed 3-2 (Mayor Winters and Commissioners Jolley and Jones dissenting).

Main Motion carried 4-1 (Commissioner Burow dissenting).

4. <u>ADDENDUMS TO MALTEUROP NORTH AMERICA WATER</u> AND SEWER AGREEMENTS.

Public Works Director Jim Rearden reported that this agenda item concerns Addendums to the Water and Sewer Agreements between MaltEurop and the City of Great Falls. The original 2004 agreements outlined responsibilities of each of the parties related to utility service to the Malt Plant north of the City. The original agreements expired on June 30, 2010, and these addendums will keep the conditions of the original agreements in place until negotiations between the two parties can be completed. Mr. Rearden noted that the date on the agreements will be modified to reflect 2011, since the agreements will not actually be executed until the new year, and the main item of remaining negotiations concerns the commercial sewer rate charged to the Malt Plant. The Malt Plant, based on the original agreements, currently pays about 60% of the commercial sewer rate. At this rate, the annual revenue adequately offsets the cost of collection and treatment; however, staff feels it is appropriate to commission a cost of service study to determine an appropriate rate structure. A proposal for this study from the City's rate consultant is forthcoming in a few days.

Commissioner Burow moved, seconded by Commissioner Bronson, that the City Commission approve the Addendum #1 to MaltEurop North America's Water Service Agreement and Addendum #1 to MaltEurop North America's Sewer Service Agreement.

Addendum #1 to MaltEurop North America Water and Sewer Agreements. Approved. OF 1348.7 Mayor Winters asked if there was any discussion amongst the Commissioners. Hearing none, Mayor Winters asked if there were any inquiries from the public.

Brett Doney, Great Falls Development Authority, residing at 3048 Delmar Drive, noted that the Malt Plant has been a huge success from a job standpoint and property tax standpoint. He hoped negotiations would come to an amicable conclusion quickly so that future possible expansion of the plant can be looked at.

Ron Gessaman, 1006 36th Avenue NE, commented that he raised an issue on March 14, 2010, when the Commission was considering Resolution 9874 setting new water and sewer rates, that the Malt Plant's contract was expiring, and that its rates had not changed in six years. He was informed he was incorrect and that the rates had been adjusted every year in accordance with the increases that were granted to sewer and water rates. He reported that he recently reviewed a Malt Plant bill that shows the rate for the past six years is still \$1.11/ccf. The current commercial sewer rate is \$1.86/ccf. Mr. Gessaman commented that the difference is a half million dollars per year. He doesn't believe one business should be favored over another business. He also noted that the rates were raised March 14, 2010, due to a reserve shortage in the sewer fund, and opined that if the half million dollars had been coming in each year there probably would not have been a reserve shortage. Mr. Gessaman inquired about the terms of the Addendums.

Mr. Rearden responded that he was not part of the 2004 contract negotiations. He does expect a proposal from the rate consultant in a few days. Both parties expect the new agreements will be completed within a two month period.

Mr. Gessaman commented that the bill indicates the Malt Plant is billed for a flat amount of sewage which is 80% of its water use. He read a portion of the contract and noted that the billing was not in accordance with the contract.

Mr. Rearden responded that there are sewer meters in place. He will look into the billing situation.

Mr. Burow inquired if there were agreements with all commercial customers for water, or was there a set rate.

Mr. Rearden responded that there is a standard form agreement for all commercial customers. This being a much larger user, the Malt Plant is different than other commercial accounts within the City.

Mayor Winters requested that Mr. Rearden check on the two meters and follow up on Mr. Gessaman's concerns that the billing is within the

parameters of the contract.

Mike Witsoe, 510 11th Street South, agreed with Mr. Gessaman's comments. He noted that the ownership of the Malt Plant has changed several times since 2004. Mr. Witsoe also discussed discharge from the Malt Plant corroding the sewer lines. He requested that this matter be postponed for two weeks.

Mr. Rearden responded that the sewer pipes are PVC and do not corrode. There has been corrosion in some of the manholes and had to be lined. The manholes, being concrete, have been affected by the H2S gas. As far as the EPA, the City, Malt Plant and Montana Refinery are working through issues with the H2S gas.

Commissioner Burow commented that it was his understanding the City asked for the EPA's assistance in dealing with the H2S gas in the sewer pipe.

Mr. Rearden responded that was correct.

Motion carried 5-0.

Planning and Community Development Director Mike Haynes commented that this change order was one quarter of one percent of the project. Once the project got underway, it was discovered additional improvements were required that weren't in the scope of the original contract.

Mayor Winters asked if there were any inquiries from the public.

Ron Gessaman, 1006 36th Avenue NE, commented that in his comments on page 4 of Item 5, the Minutes, the word "reserve" was missing, and that the comments of Mr. Wipf on page 5 did not make sense to him in that the word "project" should read "product."

With regard to Item 12, Mr. Gessaman inquired if City 7 would be able to operate the new live streaming video service without the DS-3 upgrade.

City Manager Greg Doyon responded affirmatively that City 7 could have operated with the existing bandwidth. This item was due to technology required for the terminals in police vehicles. Public safety was the driving factor in increasing the bandwidth.

Deputy City Manager Jennifer Reichelt added that, with the new AV Capture All equipment, live streaming will be done through an external site and not with this bandwidth. This bandwidth does allow for more technology features into the future.

There being no one else to address the Commission, Mayor Winters called for the vote

Motion carried 5-0.

15B. John Hubbard, 615 7th Avenue South, thanked Director Basta for his requested tree information. Mr. Hubbard inquired why the former commissioners cannot be held accountable, why taxes were raised 13 times during a recession, and why the Weissmans were not held accountable for pollution?

Mayor Winters sympathized with Mr. Hubbard's situation, but reminded him that this Commission has no control over his unfortunate accident. He respectfully asked Mr. Hubbard to speak only to matters this Commission has jurisdiction over. On behalf of Mr. Hubbard, Mayor Winters inquired the status of the Weissman property.

Mr. Haynes reported that matter is in the hands of DEQ and the property owner.

As it is not within the parameters of what this Commission could do, Mayor Winters suggested Mr. Hubbard get in touch with DEQ regarding his Weissman property questions.

15C. Ron Gessaman, 1006 36th Avenue NE, inquired what authority does ECP, a private corporation, have to get money from the City's "piggy bank," when other businesses in town can't.

Mr. Doyon responded that he asked Melissa Kinzler for an outline that had been previously provided. When he gets that document from her he will give it to City Attorney Santoro to review to specifically respond to Mr. Gessaman's question.

Mr. Gessaman requested the response before the next ECP Board meeting.

Action Requested: City Commission set public hearing for Resolution 9912.

Suggested Motion:

1. Commissioner moves:

"I move that the City Commission set a public hearing for February 15, 2011 to consider adoption of Resolution 9912."

2. Mayor calls for a second, discussion, inquires from the public, and calls the vote.

Zoning Commission Recommendation: At the conclusion of a public hearing held January 11, 2011, the Zoning Commission passed a motion recommending to the City Commission that a conditional use permit be **granted** to allow an indoor sports and recreation land use (indoor archery range), on subject property addressed as 1205 3rd Street Northwest and legally described as Mark 13C, Section 2, Township 20 North, Range 3 East, Cascade County, Montana and subject to the conditions stated with this agenda.

Background:

The ±1 acre subject property is the Rogers Jewelers site at 1205 3rd Street NW, north of the Northwest Bypass across from the K-Mart Shopping Center. The subject property is in the M-2 Mixed-use transitional zoning district and within the boundaries of Neighborhood Council #3. The applicant is proposing an indoor archery range in the existing Rogers Jewelers building. A Indoor sports and recreation may be permitted in the M-2 zoning district with conditional use approval.

Located between 3rd Street Northwest and the Burlington Northern Railroad track, the applicant owns and operates two businesses and some secondary storage in the renovated warehouse structure. A 3,812 square foot portion of the structure was most recently the home of Big Boy Motorsports; an ATV motorcycle sales business. This portion of the structure is currently

vacant. The applicant is proposing to utilize this space for an indoor archery range in addition to his other businesses in the building, Rogers Jewelers/Outlaw Embroidery.

The applicant is proposing to add stationary targets for the indoor archery range. The space will allow up to eight shooting lanes. The applicant owns and operates the other businesses in the building and the businesses will share existing restrooms. No exterior renovations are necessary for the indoor archery range. The existing site is fully landscaped and has a 40 paved parking spaces. The existing jeweler business is 2,000 square feet and is required to have 8 spaces. The existing hat and embroidery business is 1,000 square feet and is required to have 4 parking spaces. The archery range will have 8 lanes and shooting leagues will have 4 members per team; therefore the parking requirement for this use will be 32 parking spaces plus 1 per employee per shift. The total combined parking requirement for the three businesses would be 46 parking spaces. Although the existing on site parking is 6 spaces short of meeting the combined total parking requirement, the typical league shooting event would be held in the evening and the shared parking provision applies to this site and due to these factors; Staff finds the current configuration and number of parking spaces adequate for the mix of uses.

The subject property is within the area designated as the Missouri River Urban Corridor. The purpose of this plan is to present a vision for what is possible in the corridor that would promote more desirable, sustainable development that would capitalize on the river as a amenity and the potential commercial/retail resources along 3rd Street Northwest. No public access/crossing of the Burlington Railroad to the Missouri River is present at this location; but the property has direct access to the signal controlled intersection of 3rd Street Northwest and 14th Avenue Northwest and lends this property to continuation to function as a site with commercial high vehicle traffic land uses.

The existing signage for the previous business will be refaced for the indoor archery range. Signage. A Master Sign package is required to be submitted and approved prior to obtaining a sign permit.

City Code Section 17.16.36.040, Basis of Decision, requires that the Zoning Commission's recommendation and the City Commissions decision shall be based on whether the following criteria are satisfied in their review of Conditional Use Permit applications:

1. The conditional use is consistent with the City's growth policy and applicable neighborhood plans, if any.

The indoor archery range is consistent with the City's growth policy in that the existing structure has a mix of commercial uses that are benefiting from the higher traffic corridor of 3rd Street Northwest. The indoor archer range is consistent with the Missouri River Urban Corridor Plan in that this proposal provides a safe sports and recreation activity for the citizens of Great Falls.

2. The establishment, maintenance, or operation of the conditional use will not be detrimental to, or endanger the public health, safety, morals, comfort or general welfare.

Operation of the indoor archery range would not appear to be detrimental to, or endanger the public health, safety, morals, comfort or general welfare.

3. The conditional use will not be injurious to the use and enjoyment of other property in the immediate vicinity for the purposes already permitted, nor substantially diminish and impair property values within the neighborhood.

Operation of the indoor archery range on the subject property should not adversely impact the neighborhood.

4. The conditional use will not impede the normal and orderly development and improvement of the surrounding property for uses permitted in the district.

Operation of the indoor archery range within the subject property should not impede the normal and oderly development of the surrounding property.

5. Adequate utilities, access roads, drainage and/or necessary facilities have been or are being provided.

The existing utilities, access roads, drainage and/or necessary facilities are complete and adequate to support the indoor archery range.

6. Adequate measures have been or will be taken to provide ingress and egress so as to minimize traffic congestion in the public streets.

The existing facilities and the stop controlled intersection of 14th Avenue Northwest and 3rd Street Northwest are adequate to serve the addition of the indoor archery range.

7. The conditional use shall, in all other respects, conform to the applicable regulations of the district in which it is located, except as such regulations may, in each instance, be modified by the City Commission.

The indoor archery range appears to conform to the requirements of the M-2 Mixed-use transitional district.

Staff concludes no significant negative aspects, associated with the seven above mentioned criteria, should result from the approval of the conditional use permit, provided the applicant is otherwise conducting business in compliance with City Code. The approval of the conditional use permit will result in an additional business that provides a safe location for recreationalist within the community.

The Notice of Public Hearing was mailed to the neighboring property owners on December 27, 2010 and was published in the Great Falls Tribune on December 26, 2010. A sign containing copies of the Notice of Public Hearing was placed on the property on January 3, 2011. No citizens spoke as proponents or opponents during the hearing.

At the conclusion of the public hearing held January 11, 2011, the Zoning Commission passed a motion Zoning Commission recommend to the City Commission that a conditional use permit be **granted** to allow an indoor sports and recreation land use (indoor archery range), on subject property

addressed as 1205 3rd Street Northwest and legally described as Mark 13C, Section 2, Township 20 North, Range 3 East, Cascade County, Montana and subject to the following conditions:

- 1. **Building Review for Life Safety.** The applicant shall submit detailed floor and fixture plan to the City Building Official and City Fire Marshall for review. The Applicant agrees, if require by the City Officials to correct all life safety and public health requirements for the indoor archery range and the conducting of said business be completed prior to the issuing of a Safety Inspection Certificate.
- 2. **Expiration of Conditional Use Permit.** Approval of the Conditional Use by City Commission shall grant the applicant authority to submit for review for a Safety Inspection Certificate. The application must be submitted within twelve months of approval of City Commission or the Conditional Use Permit shall expire. However, upon written application filed 30 days prior to the expiration date, the Planning Official may renew the Conditional Use Permit for a one period of up to six months providing good cause is shown.
- 3. **Land Use and Zoning**. Except as provided herein, development of the property shall be consistent with the allowed uses and development standards of the M-2 Mixed-use transition district designation.
- 4. **General Code Compliance**. The proposed project shall be developed consistent with the conditions in this report, and all codes and ordinances of the City of Great Falls, the State of Montana, and all other applicable regulatory agencies.
- 5. **Subsequent modifications and additions.** If after establishment of a conditional use, the owner proposes to expand or modify the use, buildings, and/or structures, the Director of the Planning and Community Development Department shall determine in writing if such proposed change would alter the finding for one or more review criteria. If such proposed change would alter a finding, the proposal shall be submitted for review as a new conditional use application. If such proposed change would not alter a finding, the owner shall obtain all other permits as may be required.
- 6. **Master Sign Package.** The applicant shall submit detailed a sign package of all the existing and proposed signage to the City Planning & Community Development Department for review. The Applicant agrees, if require will bring all signage into compliance with the current City Code.

Concurrences: Representatives from the City's Public Works, Park and Recreation, Planning and Community Development and Fire Departments have been involved throughout the review and approval process for this project.

Fiscal Impact: Approving the conditional use permit will not require the City to provide additional service and will allow utilization of currently unoccupied building space.

Alternatives: If there are justifiable reasons to do so, the City Commission could deny the requested action to the extent allowed in City Code and State Statute.

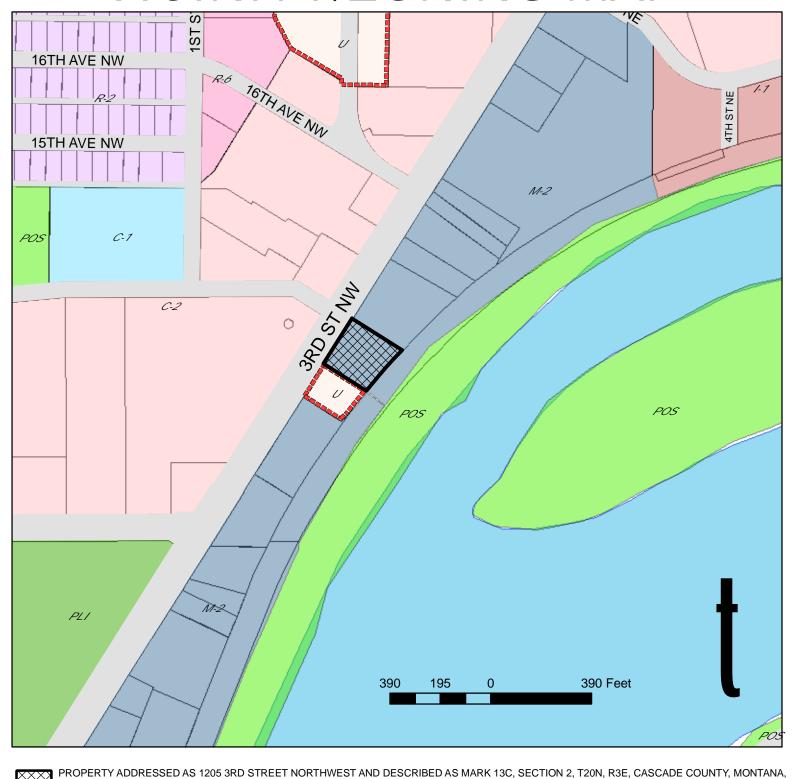

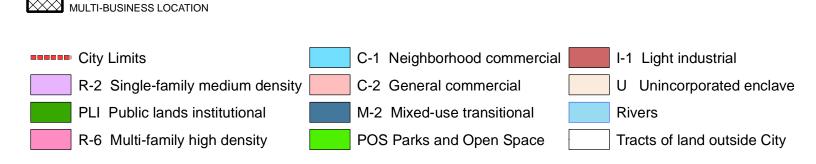

VICINITY/ZONING MAP





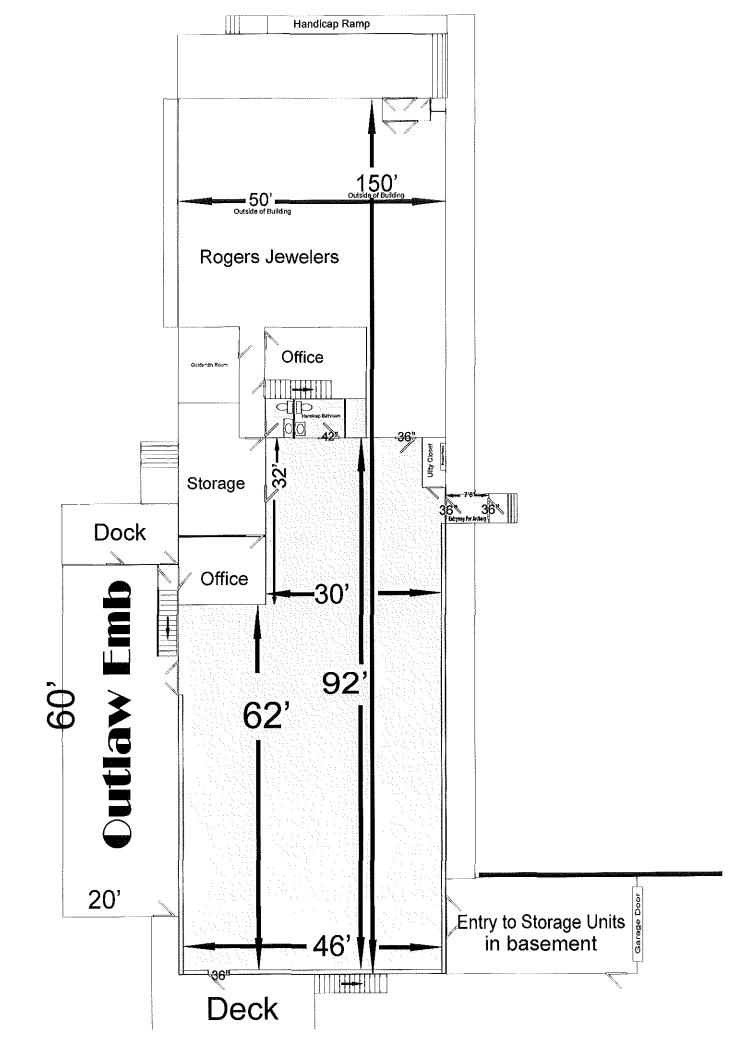

"I move the City Commission award a contract in the amount of \$157,890.00 to United Materials of Great Falls, Inc. for the <u>33rd Avenue NE Drainage Improvements and</u> Paving, O. F. 1553.1, and authorize the City Manager to execute the agreements."

2. Mayor calls for a second, discussion, inquiries from the public, and calls for the vote.

Staff Recommendation: Approve construction contract award.

Background:

Significant Impacts

This project will pave 33rd Avenue NE from Highway 87 east past 19th Street NE, and construct drainage improvements in the area. An existing water main will be extended past the paving limits as well.

Workload Impacts

City engineering staff designed the project, and will perform construction inspection and contract administration duties.

Purpose

This section of 33rd Avenue NE was recently annexed into the City along with land purchased by the City that is being planned to dry sludge from the Water Treatment Plant. Other possible uses of the land could be composting, snow storage, and potential solid waste uses. A previous project in the area installed a water main and improved the road section. This project will improve drainage in the area by constructing a drainage ditch along both sides of the road, installing culverts, and extending the water main past the pavement limits. Once these improvements are made the road will be paved.

Project Work Scope

Approximately 50 linear feet of new 8-inch water main, 220 linear feet of 12-inch drainage culvert, and 7,300 square yards of 3-inch asphalt paving will be installed on this project.

Evaluation and Selection Process

Five bids were received and opened for this project on January 5, 2011. The bids ranged from \$157,890.00 to \$183,600.00. United Materials of Great Falls, Inc. submitted the low bid and executed all the necessary bid documents.

Conclusion

City staff recommends awarding the construction contract to United Materials of Great Falls, Inc. in the amount of \$157,890.00

Fiscal Impact:

The attached bid tabulation summarizes bids that were received. This project will be funded from the water fund.

Alternatives:

The City Commission could vote to deny award of the construction contract.

Staff Recommendation: It is recommended that the City Commission authorize the City Manager to approve and sign the agreement.

Background: In December, 2010 the Great Falls Police Department Training Office received a request from the Blackfeet Nation to provide training to their newly developed Public Safety Office. The Blackfeet Nation requested training on how to respond to a homicide in progress at one of their public schools. The Great Falls Police Department has been providing this training to officers from across the state for over a decade and this was the first request to conduct the training outside of Great Falls. The Training Office prepared a cost estimate for the 3 day training and provided it to the Blackfeet Nation. The amount of \$1,886.00 was accepted and GFPD was provided the attached contract for City approval.

Fiscal Impact: None. The Great Falls Police Department will be reimbursed \$1886.00 for the training.
