Staff Recommendation: It is recommended that the City Commission appoint two new members and reappoint three members to the Community Development Council and adjust the terms of remaining members.

Background: The terms of Steven Hurin, Robert Dean Rudeseal, and Maria Valandra expire on January 31, 2011. All three members are eligible for and interested in reappointment. Adam Gill has moved away from Great Falls and Dale Schwanke is not eligible to be reappointed; so it

is necessary to appoint two new members. It is recommended that the newly appointed members serve two-year terms so the overall membership has staggered ending terms.

The Planning and Community Development Department is requesting that the general expiration date for terms on the CDC be moved from January 31st to October 31st. The adjustment of the incoming date of November 1st for newly appointed members will allow a better opportunity for them to be involved at the onset of the grant process and attend the application workshop. Therefore, it is necessary to adjust standing member terms to reflect the October 31st date.

Purpose

To ensure citizen participation in the CDBG allocation process, a ten-member volunteer advisory board is appointed by the City Commission. The Community Development Council makes funding recommendations for projects applying for CDBG funding to the City Commission. Members must live within the city limits.

Evaluation and Selection Process

Advertising was done in the *Great Falls Tribune* and on the City of Great Falls Website. Two applications were received.

Staff Recommendation: Staff recommends that the City Commission approve the Memorandum of Understanding between the City of Great Falls and the Great Falls Hebrew Association.

Background: The Great Falls Hebrew Association (GFHA) also known as Congregation Aitz Chaim and the City agree that the City's annual holiday display represents the diversity of faiths and traditions in the Great Falls community. The GFHA contacted the City in December of 2007 and expressed a desire to display a Chanukah Menorah in front of the Civic Center as part of the City's annual holiday display. The City agreed to GFHA's request and welcomed the addition to the holiday display in front of the Civic Center.

Following over a year of fundraising efforts by the GFHA, the nine foot tall electric Menorah was ordered and delivered to the City Park and Recreation Department. The Menorah was displayed in front of the Civic Center during the 2009 holiday season as part of the City's annual holiday display.

The MOU proposed by the GFHA outlines the responsibilities of the City and the responsibilities of GFHA regarding the Menorah display. The City will be responsible for storing the display outside of the holiday season, providing maintenance and erecting the display in front of the Civic Center annually. GFHA will be responsible for lighting the display and bulb replacement.

If the City desires to discontinue its practice of erecting the Menorah display, it will return the Menorah to GFHA or any potential future successor organization.

Concurrences: Great Falls Hebrew Association and City staff. The MOU has been reviewed by the City Attorney.

Fiscal Impact: The Park and Recreation will spend approximately 1 hour annually to erect and take down the display and there will by some minimal electricity costs.

Alternatives: To not approve the MOU with GFHA for the Menorah display.

Memorandum of Understanding

WHEREAS the City of Great Falls ("City") erects an annual holiday season display in front of the Civic Center, and

WHEREAS part of the mission of the Great Falls Hebrew Association ("GFHA"), also known as Congregation Aitz Chaim (originally incorporated in 1916), is to promote understanding among the residents of the City, and

WHEREAS GFHA and the City agree that the City's annual holiday display represents the diversity of faiths and traditions in the Great Falls community.

Therefore GFHA and the City desire to enter into the following understanding regarding the display of a Chanukah Menorah in front of the Civic Center.

- 1. GFHA will deliver an outdoor, electric Chanukah Menorah to the City.
- 2. The City will erect this Menorah in front of the Civic Center annually.
- GFHA will provide the City with an annual schedule of the Jewish holiday of Chanukah.
- 4. The Menorah will remain in place in front of the Civic Center for the entirety of the Chanukah holiday.
- 5. The City will store the Menorah outside of the holiday season.
- 6. The City will be responsible for the ongoing maintenance and upkeep of the Menorah. In case of damage or vandalism to the Menorah, the City will ensure that the Menorah is repaired or replaced as it was in its original condition. The City has been informed that the original cost of the Menorah was approximately \$1,500.00.
- 7. If The Menorah is displayed outside of the holiday of Chanukah, all nine bulbs should be lit.
- 8. If in the course of future decisions, the City desires to discontinue its practice of erecting the Menorah annual holiday display, it will return the Menorah to GFHA, or any potential future successor organization.
- 9. During the holiday of Chanukah, GFHA will be solely responsible for lighting the Menorah. Further, GFHA will be responsible for providing and/or replacing the Menorah bulbs, as needed. The lighting of the

Menorah will be lit according to Jewish Custom, as set forth below as follows:

- a. On the first night of Chanukah, the center bulb (the shammos) and the light to the farthest right when facing from the front shall be lit.
- b. On the second night of Chanukah, the center bulb (the shammos) and the two lights to the farthest right when facing from the front shall be lit.
- c. On the third night of Chanukah, the center bulb (the shammos) and the three lights to the farthest right when facing from the front shall be lit.
- d. On the fourth night of Chanukah, the center bulb (the shammos) and the four lights to the farthest right when facing from the front shall be lit.
- e. On the fifth night of Chanukah, the center bulb (the shammos) and the five lights to the farthest right when facing from the front shall be lit.
- f. On the sixth night of Chanukah, the center bulb (the shammos) and the six lights to the farthest right when facing from the front shall be lit.
- g. On the seventh night of Chanukah, the center bulb (the shammos) and the seven lights to the farthest right when facing from the front shall be lit.
- h. On the eight night of Chanukah, the center bulb (the shammos) and all other bulbs shall be lit.

Staff Recommendation: Staff recommends that the City Commission approve the Memorandum of Understanding between the Great Falls Development Authority (GFDA) and the City of Great Falls regarding the use of Ag-Tech Industrial Tax Increment District Funds.

Background

The District: On May 17, 2005, the City Commission adopted Ordinance 2911, creating the Central Montana Agricultural and Technology Park Tax Increment Industrial Infrastructure District. The original TI District boundaries included the malting plant site. On November 6, 2007 the City Commission approved the annexation and zoning of the MT Megawatts property, previously owned by Montgomery Energy and now owned by Dali, Inc. On December 4, 2007 Ordinance 2996 amended the Central Montana Agricultural and Technology Park Tax Increment Industrial Infrastructure District to include Lot 5, Block 1, International Malting Company, LLC addition, and the abutting segment of U.S. Highway 87. On August 17, 2010 the City Commission approved a Consultant Services Agreement with Community Development Services of Montana (CDS) to assist the City of Great Falls in completing the steps necessary to expand

the Central Montana Ag-Tech Tax Increment District again, including the annexation of properties currently outside the incorporated limits of the City of Great Falls.

The Transportation Study: On November 18, 2008, the City Commission approved a Memorandum of Understanding between the City and GFDA to complete preliminary engineering and design work for an access road from US 87 East to Black Eagle Road. On July 21, 2009, the Commission authorized funding of additional engineering services and scope of work to be managed by GFDA in accordance with City requirements. The purpose of the additional services was to identify what volumes the additional traffic on the 33rd Ave NE intersection could accommodate with limited improvements. Subsequently two appropriations to pave Black Eagle Road have been awarded resulting in increased potential that development in the area is likely to occur in the near future. Detailed planning related to the access road should be addressed to prepare for the impacts resulting from future development. Therefore the Commission is now requested to authorize funding of an add-on study that will provide a detailed project description and budget for the preferred access road. The results of the study can be used to secure funding, either through the GF transportation planning process or as an appropriation.

Concurrences: A Task Force, made up of City, County and MDT staff, property owners, developers, engineers and other partners support funding of the add-on the proposal "as it is a continuing component of the study to provide better access to the TIF district. Providing better access will encourage further development". The add-on study is an eligible tax increment project under Section 7-15-4288(4), MCA. If the MOU is approved, GFDA agrees to provide project management and submit all payables in accordance with City requirements.

Fiscal Impact: If approved, the Central Montana Ag-Tech Tax Increment District has up to \$17,500 in funds available.

Alternatives: If the Memorandum of Understanding is not approved the GFDA would have to look for an alternative funding source for the study, which could delay completion of the add-on study and subsequently delay submittals for funding requests.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

Great Falls Develop	nent Authority, a registered non-profit development corporation in
the State of Montana	, hereinafter called the GFDA.

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the City and the GFDA approved an MOU on August 5, 2008, and revised the MOU on November 18, 2008, to fund a preliminary design and cost estimates for a public access road from US 87 East to Black Eagle Road in order to move forward with obtaining funding for the project, and

WHEREAS, the City participated in the original and updated RFP/RFQ process where T.D. & H. Engineering was contracted to complete the original contract, and

WHEREAS, the City agreed on July 21, 2009, to allow the GFDA to accept additional engineering services and Scope of Work from T.D. & H., and

WHEREAS, the preliminary design identified 33 Ave NE as the preferred alternative for a south access point to the proposed industrial area, and

WHEREAS, the GFDA has obtained funds to do roadway improvements on Black Eagle Road in the Ag-Tech Industrial Tax Increment District, and

WHEREAS, the North Industrial Area Task Force has determined that an addon feasibility study to the original Access Road Study is needed to study alternatives to improve Hwy 87 intersection flow for increased traffic from the preferred access road, and

WHEREAS, this add-on feasibility study will benefit the existing Ag-Tech Industrial Tax Increment District, and

WHEREAS, there are funds available within the Ag-Tech Industrial Increment District to pay the costs of the preliminary design and cost estimates for the described feasibility study,

NOW, therefore, it is hereby understood and agreed as follows:

The City agrees to allow the GFDA to accept the addition to the contract with T.D. & H. in the amount not to exceed \$17,500 for the purpose of obtaining an add-on feasibility study and preliminary geometric layout of design alternatives for the 33rd Ave NE intersection. The study will result in a detailed project description and budget that could be used to secure funding for construction of the preferred alternative, either through the City GF transportation plan process or as an appropriation.

Great Falls Development Authority (GFDA) is requesting TIF funds from the City of Great Falls (COGF) in the amount of \$17,500 to do an add-on feasibility study to the original North Industrial Area Access Road Study. This applies to the original area that the TIF was assessed for. It has been a 3 year process working with the North Industrial Area Task Force and I would like to give you a condensed history of the project to this point.

On November 18, 2008, the City Commission approved a MOU between the GFDA and the COGF regarding the use of TIF funds for a preliminary engineering design and cost estimate for an access road from US 87 East to Black Eagle Road. The design identified 33rd Ave NE as the preferred alternative for a south access point to the proposed industrial area north of Great Falls.

The Task Force, made up of City, County and MDT staff, property owners, developers, engineers and other partners looked at the issues related to putting more traffic on US 87. A study was added to identify what volumes the additional traffic on the 33rd Ave. intersection could accommodate with limited improvements under the original MOU. During this time, two appropriations for paving of Black Eagle Road were awarded which led to discussion that this could encourage development in the area at a more rapid rate and the access road issue would definitely need to be addressed.

Recommendations were to hold a brainstorming session with MDT Helena & Great Falls to look at alternatives for the 33rd AVE NE intersection. After the meeting, a report outlining the results of the brainstorming session was presented to the task force. The group's consensus was that a roundabout is the most viable option, along with a feasibility study and preliminary geometric layout. The design would result in a detailed project description and budget that could be used to secure funding, either through the GF transportation plan process or as an appropriation.

The August 26th task force meeting approved going ahead with the study to develop the 3 alternatives that were discussed in the brainstorming session. TD & H prepared an engineering fee estimate and scope of work for the study. It was agreed by the task force that GFDA should contact the COGF about obtaining TIF funding. I have attached the Scope of Work and Fee Estimate for your review.

To clarify, GFDA is requesting \$17,500 in TIF funds for the add-on feasibility study. If you have any questions, please give me a call.

Staff Recommendation: Staff recommends the Commission approve adoption of Resolution 9907.

Background:

In 2009, the Montana Legislature approved a pilot program to designate certain roadways as *scenic-historic byways* to begin to identify roadways of especial value to the State. In recognizing roadways of exemplary intrinsic, scenic, historic, recreational, cultural, archaeological, educational, or natural value, a scenic (or historic) byway would also be expected to enhance the experience of the traveling public; stimulate or allow for economic development and new marketing strategies; or preserve intrinsic resources for the benefit of future generations.

While the State program is just beginning, the National Scenic Byways Program has been around for more than 15 years. The National program was established under the 1991 Federal transportation act, which set aside \$74.3 million for eligible roadways and projects. A formal program for designation was developed in 1995, identifying specific "intrinsic qualities" that a roadway must meet in order to be considered for inclusion in the program. The roadway was expected to be significant in at least two of the following areas: Archaeological, Cultural, Historic, Natural, Recreational, and Scenic.

Although most states quickly recognized the value of a scenic byways program and established their own programs and guidelines, Montana did not – largely due to misconceptions about what the designation means and how it may influence adjoining properties. Montana is one of the last states to establish such a program.

Montana has a number of scenic roadways designated under the federal BLM and Forest Service byways programs, as well as the nationally designated Beartooth Highway. These Byways were

established by the federal agencies with control over the lands the roads traverse. Until now, however, there has been no mechanism for recognition of scenic roadways that do not cross federal lands.

The main value in the designation can be summed in one word: *tourism*. Although state designation does not currently carry with it a funded marketing effort, local roadway managers and supporters can use that designation in advertising campaigns. If the roadway rises to national designation, it includes a free, well-established national marketing effort, showcased through the Program's website: http://www.bywaysonline.org/. The National Byways organization provides marketing assistance, a clearinghouse for information, and a "go to" location for tourists interested in seeing the best America has to offer. The National website also provides links to local or state byways websites.

It is important to note that, with the exception of a specific constraint on outdoor advertising, there are <u>no</u> restrictions, limitations, laws, codes, fees, taxes or any other governmental action associated with the program – it is simply a method to recognize and promote the roadways. The aforementioned advertising restriction is a prohibition on new outdoor advertising (billboards) along roadways that are on the Federal Interstate or Primary roadway systems. Giant Springs Road is not on either system.

Application for Designation:

Along with seven other roadways, Giant Springs Road was included in legislation directing the Montana Department of Transportation to establish a state scenic-historic byways pilot program. The result is a set of guidelines for the nomination and designation of the roadways – as shown on the program's website: http://www.mdt.mt.gov/travinfo/scenic/. An Advisory Council has been established, and the Council will help to move the pilot roadways into a formal program.

The Council has requested applications be submitted quickly to allow it to provide a report to the legislature in the next few months. An application for Giant Springs Road has been prepared and forwarded by the Montana Department of Fish, Wildlife and Parks. For the roadway application to be accepted by the Department of Transportation, it must be supported by local jurisdictions (Great Falls and Cascade County) as well as property owners adjoining the roadway. The Montana Department of Fish, Wildlife and Parks, as the majority property owner along the roadway, has agreed to take the lead on the application and will help the nomination process move forward.

If approved, Giant Springs Road would be one of two roadways to receive the first designations as State Scenic-Historic Roadways.

Concurrences: The Montana Department of Fish, Wildlife and Parks concurs in the designation of the roadway as a Montana Scenic-Historic Byway, and the Cascade County Board of Commissioners will consider support at its October 26, 2010 meeting.

Fiscal Impact: There would be no fiscal impact to the City of Great Falls as a result of adoption of this resolution, nor as a result of designation of Giant Springs Road as a State Scenic-Historic Byway.

Alternatives: The City Commission could vote to not approve adoption of Resolution 9907.

RESOLUTION 9907

A RESOLUTION OF SUPPORT FOR THE GIANT SPRINGS ROAD STATE SCENIC-HISTORIC BYWAY DESIGNATION

* * * * * * * * *

WHEREAS, The State of Montana has created a Montana Scenic-Historic Byways Program and Montana Scenic-Historic Byways Pilot Project; and

WHEREAS, the Scenic-Historic Byways Pilot Project allows for specific Montana roadways to be nominated for designation as a Montana Scenic-Historic Byway, including Giant Springs Road; and

WHEREAS, there are no land-use controls or other restrictions associated with Montana Scenic-Historic Byway designation.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF GREAT FALLS, MONTANA:

Section 1. As the Governmental entity with jurisdiction over a portion of Giant Springs Road, the City of Great Falls concurs with and fully supports the designation of Giant Springs Road as a Montana Scenic-Historic Byway;

Karen Grove, Chair NC 8, reminded council members that their meeting is Thursday, October 21, 2010, at 6 p.m., at the Great Falls Pre-Release Center. The last Council of Council meeting and issues affecting the neighborhood and City will be discussed.

BOARDS & COMMISSIONS

Amended Plat, Lot 7A, Block 1, Great Falls Market Place Subdivision. Approved.

3. AMENDED PLAT, LOT 7A, BLOCK 1, GREAT FALLS MARKET PLACE SUBDIVISION, LOCATED IN THE SW4 OF SECTION 15, TOWNSHIP 20 NORTH, RANGE 3 EAST, P.M.M.

On September 28, 2010, the Planning Advisory Board recommended approval of an amended plat for the Holiday Inn Express property at Market Place. The existing ± 3.25 acre property is zoned C-2 and addressed as 1625 Market Place Drive. The request is to subdivide existing Lot 7A into two lots - Lot 7AA being the ± 2.25 acre lot on which the Holiday Inn Express was recently constructed and Lot 7AB being a ± 1 acre vacant lot on Market Place Drive that would be available for future development. Proposed Lot 7AB meets the minimum standards of the C-2 zoning district and has access to utilities, street frontage and signage allowance.

Mr. Haynes requested that the City Commission approve the amended plat.

Commissioner Bronson moved, seconded by Commissioners Burow and Jones, that the City Commission approve the Amended Plat of Lot 7A, Block 1, Great Falls Market Place Subdivision, located in the SW¹/₄ of Section 15, Township 20 North, Range 3 East, P.M.M.

Mayor Winters asked if there was any discussion amongst the Commissioners or inquiries from the public. Hearing none, Mayor Winters called for the vote.

Motion carried 5-0.

4. MISCELLANEOUS REPORTS AND ANNOUNCEMENTS.

There were no miscellaneous reports and announcements from members of board and commissions.

PUBLIC HEARINGS

Res. 9901 and Ord. 3058. Adopted.

5A. RESOLUTION 9901, APPROVES MINOR PLAT AND ANNEXES GREAT FALLS INDUSTRIAL PARK, SECTION 4, LOCATED IN NE¹/₄NW¹/₄, S 31, T20N, R4E, P.M.M.

5B. ORDINANCE 3058, ASSIGNS ZONING CLASSIFICATION OF I-2 HEAVY INDUSTRIAL DISTRICT.

Planning and Community Development Director Mike Haynes reported that the Public Works Compost Facility comprises ± 20.6 acres of property located on 33rd Avenue NE about ½ mile east of the intersection of Old Havre Highway and U.S. Highway 87. The primary purpose of the Compost Facility will be to compost yard waste. It will also be used to dry alum sludge from the water plant before disposal at the landfill. In the future the site could be used as a waste transfer station.

Resolution 9901 relates to the annexation and minor plat of the subject property and Ordinance 3058 relates to the assignment of I-2 (Heavy Industrial) zoning to the property.

Annexation will not only incorporate this city-owned property, but will also allow adjacent privately-owned properties to annex into the City and accommodate new urban development.

At its August 10, 2010, meeting, the Planning Advisory Board recommended approval of the annexation and minor plat and the Planning Advisory Board, acting as the Zoning Commission, recommended approval of assigning I-2 zoning to the subject property upon annexation.

After conducting the public hearing, Mr. Haynes requested the City

Commission adopt Resolution 9901 and Ordinance 3058.

Mayor Winters declared the public hearing open.

Speaking in opposition to Resolution 9901 and Ordinance 3058 were:

Kathy Gessaman, 1006 36th Avenue NE, suggested the assignment of light industrial instead of heavy industrial zoning.

Mr. Haynes responded that the proposed zoning is reflective of zoning in that area surrounded by county property. It is anticipated that future annexations will occur and property owners will be asking to retain the I-2 zoning. It is a manner of consistency.

Ms. Gessaman inquired about the agricultural land in the area.

Mr. Haynes responded that adjacent property owners have expressed an interest in developing those properties for industrial, which is the equivalent zoning in the county right now. From a planning perspective, it is the logical choice.

Ron Gessaman, 1006 36th Avenue NE, referenced § 7-2-4601, MCA, and opined that the proposal was a "flag pole" annexation. He expressed concerns regarding traffic, diverting City resources, and non-authorized expenditures. He inquired how much money was invested in infrastructure on this property.

Mr. Haynes explained that this property is contiguous by annexing the right-of-way. Solutions to the intersection concerns are being discussed between the City, County and Montana Department of Transportation (MDT).

With regard to infrastructure, Public Works Director Jim Rearden added that the water main and roadway were publicly bid and awarded by the Commission. With regard to improvements to the intersection, the Great Falls Development Authority has Thomas, Dean & Hoskins performing a study to look at alternatives.

John Hubbard, 615 7th Avenue South, requested clarification regarding relocation of the Convenience Center.

Mr. Rearden responded that State approval was recently obtained to dry Water Treatment Plant sludge in that area before taking it to the landfill. This will allow not as much tonnage to haul, and will reduce the cost of disposal. The process has begun for obtaining a license for a compost yard. The recycling facility will stay within the City. Relocation of the transfer station will be considered at such time as it makes a profit.

Mr. Hubbard expressed concerns about the distance people will have to

travel to dispose of items at this location.

No one spoke in favor of Resolution 9901 and Ordinance 3058.

Mayor Winters declared the public hearing closed and asked for the direction of the City Commission.

Commissioner Jolley moved, seconded by Commissioner Bronson, that the City Commission adopt Resolution 9901, and approve the minor plat of Great Falls Industrial Park, Section 4, located in NE¹/₄NW¹/₄, Section 31, Township 21 North, Range 4 East, Cascade County, Montana, and the accompanying Findings of Fact.

Mayor Winters asked if there was any discussion amongst the Commissioners.

Commissioner Burow inquired about the importance of annexing at this time.

Mr. Haynes responded that it makes sense to annex City-owned property into the City boundaries. Property owners to the east are interested in developing that property and would be responsible for extending the roadway and utilities.

Commissioner Burow inquired the status of the property between 15th Street and the City parcel.

Mr. Haynes reported that there are businesses along there, and some property owners have expressed an interest in being annexed.

Commissioner Jolley noted that it is contiguous now by bringing in sections of Old Havre Highway, as opposed to how it used to be done.

Motion carried 5-0.

Commissioner Bronson moved, seconded by Commissioner Jones, that the City Commission adopt Ordinance 3058.

Mayor Winters asked if there was any discussion amongst the Commissioners. No one responded.

Motion carried 5-0.

Ord, 3059. Denied.

6. ORDINANCE 3059, REZONE LOTS 1-5, BLOCK 611, FIFTH ADDITION TO GREAT FALLS TOWNSITE FROM C-2 GENERAL COMMERCIAL DISTRICT TO R-3 SINGLE-FAMILY HIGH-DENSITY DISTRICT.

Planning and Community Development Director Mike Haynes reported that Ordinance 3059 pertains to the proposed rezoning of property in the 1500 block of 1st Avenue NW from C-2 (General Commercial) to R-3 (Single family high density residential).

The applicant owns vacant Lot 5 that Habitat for Humanity is interested in acquiring for development of a new affordable single-family home. The owner of the single-family home on Lots 1-4 had, until yesterday, agreed to be a part of the rezoning. Lot 6 currently contains a mobile home. That owner was not interested in rezoning his property to residential having plans to possibly sell the lot in the future to an adjacent business.

On August 24, 2010, the Planning Advisory Board, acting as the Zoning Commission, recommended approval of rezoning the five lots consistent with the staff recommendation. The staff recommendation for approval was based upon the finding that the new zoning is consistent with the existing residential land uses on the property, that the residential neighborhood is viable and indeed improving with some newly constructed homes and home renovations and, that while the existing mix of commercial and residential land uses is not ideal, the future for this residential neighborhood may just as easily be one of stabilization and expansion, rather than commercial encroachment.

Neighborhood Council 2 took a position in support of the rezoning of the five lots from C-2 to R-3.

A letter was received yesterday from the owner of Lots 1-4 stating that he now opposes the rezoning. Another letter was received today from the business owner across the alley to the south of the subject properties also opposing the rezoning. Said letters were provided to the Commission earlier this evening.

The owner of Lot 5 has, in good faith, applied for and paid for a rezoning and gone all the way through the process to tonight's public hearing. Staff's position on the rezoning may have been different if, from the initiation of the process, no other property owners on the block agreed to rezone.

The property on Lots 1-4 will remain residential even though it retains C-2 zoning.

Staff recommends adoption of Ordinance 3059, amended to rezone only Lot 5, Block 611, Fifth Addition to Great Falls Townsite, Cascade County, Montana.

Mayor Winters declared the public hearing open.

Speaking in opposition to Ordinance 3059 were:

Steven Rogers, #2 15th Street NW, owner of property adjacent to the property being discussed, expressed safety concerns with kids and trucks in the alley way. Mr. Rogers commented that the brochure incorrectly referred to Lots 1-6 as being attainable via 1st Avenue NW. The lots are only accessible from the alley way. Mr. Rogers also noted that Vaughn Road has always been a business environment.

Brian Rogers, #2 15th Street NW, owner of property adjacent to the property being discussed, also expressed concerns regarding access to his property and safety issues.

Roger May, 217 Vaughn Road, commented that he is the owner of the Parts Store that delivers to Mr. Rogers' business four or five times per day. The access is very poor and it is hard for trucks to turn around. He concluded that zoning property residential in this area will make it worse, and that there are better places for cheaper housing.

The City Clerk also received written letters in opposition from **Joseph Becker**, 1508 1st Avenue NW, and **Brian Rogers**, #2 15th Street NW.

Speaking in favor of Ordinance 3059 were:

Nathan Hoines, residing at 3509 12th Avenue South, commented that he is the Attorney representing the owner of Lot 5. Mr. Hoines argued that the neighboring property to the south is residential, including two high school houses and a Habitat for Humanity house. Whether this property contains a commercial building or a residence, the same problems exist with access. The lots being discussed already contain two residential houses. Putting an affordable house in this neighborhood makes sense. Mr. Hoines pointed out that the Planning Board has carefully considered this matter, including access, and has recommended the rezone. Mr. Hoines urged the Commission to adopt Ordinance 3059.

Susan McCord, Executive Director for Habitat for Humanity, commented that she understands the concerns expressed in opposition, but clarified that Habitat for Humanity does not build cheap homes; it builds decent, affordable homes that improve neighborhoods.

There being no one else to address the Commission, Mayor Winters declared the public hearing closed and asked for the direction of the City Commission.

Commissioner Burow moved, seconded by Commissioner Jolley, that the City Commission deny Ordinance 3059.

Mayor Winters asked if there was any discussion amongst the Commissioners.

Commissioner Jolley commented that, if there are justifiable reasons to do so, the City Commission could deny the requested action to the extent allowed in City Code and State Statute. She inquired if there were any restrictions regarding Mr. Haynes' suggestion to only changing the zoning on Lot 5.

Mr. Haynes responded that the last thing he would want to do is to rezone someone's property against their will. All through the process, the owner of Lots 1-4 was in favor of the rezoning, but now has opposed the rezoning in writing.

Commissioner Jolley inquired if the property owners around the property being requested to be rezoned were contacted.

Mr. Haynes responded that they had an opportunity to appear at the Planning Board and City Commission meetings. The neighboring properties were noticed, and advertising did occur. He clarified that at the beginning the property owners of Lots 1-6 were all in favor of rezoning. The ownership of Lot 6 changed and the new owner was not in favor of rezoning. That is the reason that staff only took Lots 1-5, those in favor of rezoning, to the Planning Board. Now, at the eleventh hour, the owner of Lots 1-4 is not in favor of the rezoning. Only the original applicant, owner of Lot 5, is asking for the rezoning

Commissioner Jones expressed concerns that the owner of Lot 5 continued through the entire rezoning process in good faith, only to have others change their minds at the eleventh hour. It is a fairness issue that needs to be looked at.

Commissioner Bronson also noted that fairness is a consideration. He explained that there are a lot of residential properties running through the west side area. By the time you reach Vaughn Road there are a lot of businesses with few residences. As originally presented to the Planning Board that Lots 1-5 would all be rezoned residential, there was some sense to that. It was consistent with the block to the east on 1st Avenue NW. Now, the other landowners do not want to change the use of their properties. He expressed concern agreeing to rezoning that will only affect one of the six lots, with the other five remaining commercial.

Commissioner Burow echoed Commissioner Bronson, and added that his concern would be residences complaining about commercial businesses.

Commissioner Jolley suggested that, rather than using the term "eleventh hour," the term "appointed hour" should be used as it is the governing body of the City of Great Falls at these public hearings that decides these matters.

Motion carried 4-1 (Commissioner Jones dissenting).

OLD BUSINESS

NEW BUSINESS

Certificate of Survey and Memorandum of Understanding all related to Marks 14E1 and 14X, located in NE¹/₄ S36, T21N, R3E. Accepted. 7. CERTIFICATE OF SURVEY AND MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING, ALL RELATED TO MARKS 14e1 AND 14x, LOCATED IN NE¹/₄ SECTION 36, TOWNSHIP 21 NORTH, RANGE 3 EAST, P.M.M. AND THE DEDICATION OF RIGHTS-OF-WAY.

Planning and Community Development Director Mike Haynes reported that the City needs these two Certificates of Survey representing right-of-way (ROW) in order to complete the street network along 36th Avenue NE just west of Bootlegger Trail.

The Certificates of Survey describe a 60-foot ROW on the north side of 36th Avenue NE that will connect to 12th Street NE that is now partially constructed through Northview Addition, and a 70-foot ROW on the south side of 36th Avenue NE that will connect 14th Street NE to the Water Tower Park subdivision. These are street connections that the City always intended to make, but was not able to achieve with the previous owner of the properties on either side of 36th Avenue NE. The new property owner, Darin Vick, plans to develop the property on the north side of 36th Avenue NE with storage units and, in rezoning that property to "B – Business" in the County, has agreed to donate the two properties to the City for ROW.

Mr. Haynes reported that this is a win-win situation for City and County residents in the area in terms of improved connectivity and relieving traffic, as well as several benefits the property owner. He requested that the City Commission accept the Certificates of Survey.

Commissioner Bronson moved, seconded by Commissioner Burow, that the City Commission accept Certificate of Survey of Marks 14E1 and 14X, located in NE½ Section 36, Township 21 North, Range 3 East, P.M.M. Cascade County, and the dedication of rights-of-way and Memorandum of Understanding.

Mayor Winters asked if there was any discussion amongst the Commissioners.

Commissioner Jolley asked for clarification regarding the fiscal impact.

Mr. Haynes explained that escrowed funds are available to make the street improvement and utility connection. Pursuant to the terms of the MOU, the new owner of the properties would not be under obligation to pay for the improvements because the City already has the escrowed funds.

Mayor Winters asked if there were any inquiries from the public.

Ron Gessaman, 1006 36th Avenue NE, inquired about the number of approaches, and cost of improvements on 36th Avenue NE.

Mr. Haynes responded that the number of approaches depends on the project and future development. No road improvements are planned on 36th Avenue NE unless a majority of property owners are interested in contributing.

Public Works Director Jim Rearden added that there is no leverage to require improvements since the property remains in the County.

Motion carried 5-0.

Water Main Construction Agreement with Upper/Lower River Road Water & Sewer District, Phase 4. Approved. OF 1354.3

8. WATER MAIN CONSTRUCTION AGREEMENT WITH UPPER/LOWER RIVER ROAD WATER AND SEWER DISTRICT, PHASE 4.

Public Works Director Jim Rearden reported that the City began discussions with the City/County Health Department in 1996 concerning ground water and drinking water quality problems experienced in the Upper/Lower River Road area. Since that time a Water and Sewer Board has been formed and three service districts have received water and sewer improvements. Completion of a 1,800 foot gap would strengthen flows and service to the far south end of the system. The cost to install the water main is approximately \$172,000. The District has \$110,000 for that purpose, and has asked the City to pay the remaining \$62,000. The District would have the work performed through a change order with the current District 3 contractor. The District would also be paying for all engineering, inspection and contract administration on the project.

Commissioner Bronson moved, seconded by Commissioners Burow and Jones, that the City Commission approve the Agreement between the City of Great Falls and Upper/Lower River Road Water and Sewer District for Upper River Road Water Main Extension and authorize the City Manager to execute the construction contract documents.

Mayor Winters asked if there was any discussion amongst the Commissioners. Hearing none, Mayor Winters asked if there were any inquiries from the public.

John Stephenson-Love, 300 40th Avenue South, Board President of the ULRR Water & Sewer District, reported that there are remaining funds from Phase 3 of the project. This presents an opportunity to complete the water main loop between Service Districts 3 and 1.

Motion carried 5-0.

ORDINANCES/RESOLUTIONS

Ord. 3061. Accepted on first reading and set public hearing for November 16, 2010.

9. ORDINANCE 3061, ASSIGN CITY ZONING TO SERVICE DISTRICT NO. 3 OF THE UPPER/LOWER RIGHT ROAD WATER & SEWER DISTRICT.

Planning and Community Development Director Mike Haynes reported that Ordinance 3061 pertains to the proposed annexation of 38 properties in the Upper/Lower River Road area and the assignment of R-1, R-2 and R-3 zoning to the various properties depending on lot size.

The Water and Sewer District is responsible for establishing Service Areas, gathering the requisite number of signatures authorizing annexation, submitting the annexation request to the City and funding and coordinating water and sewer system projects with Public Works.

The City Commission approved Service District 1 that comprised 170 parcels in 2007 and Service District 2 that comprised 81 parcels in 2009. This request is to approve Service District 3 that would bring the total number of parcels annexed into the City from this area to 289.

On September 14, 2010, the Planning Advisory Board/Zoning Commission recommended approval of the proposed annexation and assigning R-1, R-2 and R-3 zoning to various properties within Service District 3.

Commissioner Jones moved, seconded by Commissioner Burow, that the City Commission accept Ordinance 3061 on first reading and set a public hearing for November 16, 2010.

Mayor Winters asked if there was any discussion amongst the Commissioners or inquiries from the public. Hearing none, Mayor Winters called for the vote.

Motion carried 5-0.

Item 16, public hearing not set for November 16, 2010, on Resolution 9905. The remainder of the Consent Agenda was approved.

Mayor Winters asked if there was any discussion amongst the Commissioners.

Commissioner Jolley commented that she would like to wait to set a public hearing. She explained that customers were sent a letter, and she is interested in learning at the next Electric City Power Board meeting which customers the rate increase would be set for.

Commissioner Burow concurred with Commissioner Jolley.

Commissioner Bronson inquired if the customer letter dated October 11, 2010, attached to Agenda Report 16, had been mailed to customers.

Fiscal Services Director Coleen Balzarini responded that the letter to customers of the Pilot Program had gone out.

Mayor Winters inquired about all the customers of ECP.

Ms. Balzarini responded that letter was being handled by the City Manager.

Commissioner Bronson inquired if there was any information communicated to the Pilot Program customers about the public hearing in November at the time the letter went out.

Ms. Balzarini responded that the letter requests a voluntary approval by the customer for a 15% increase for energy consumed September 1, 2010 – June 30, 2011. The Commission needs to approve that rate for those that mail back their voluntary approvals.

Commissioner Bronson asked Ms. Balzarini if she saw any complication with not holding the public hearing until hearing back from customers willing to respond.

Ms. Balzarini responded that the only complication is that it is for consumption since September 1. If this public hearing is delayed, it probably would be reset the last meeting in December.

Motion carried 5-0.

Commissioner Bronson moved, seconded by Commissioners Jolley and Jones, that the City Commission approve the remainder of the Consent Agenda as presented.

Mayor Winters asked if there was any discussion amongst the Commissioners. No one responded.

Mayor Winters asked if there were any inquiries from the public.

Cyndi Baker, 500 Montana Avenue NW, with regard to Item 14, Ms. Baker asked if any guidelines had been addressed. She found the political signs on the property of the community garden offensive.

Mayor Winters reminded Ms. Baker that, even though it is a community garden, it is private property.

Ron Gessaman, 1006 36th Avenue NE, referred to Item 20 and commented that, if there was no history of water main breaks, how could staff determine fiscal impact.

With regard to Item 22, Mr. Gessaman noted that he previously pointed out the need to have equity of restrooms.

Commissioner Burow commented that discussions prior to Commission approval were that the bathrooms were adequate. A professional engineer prepared the plans, and he assumed the same engineer would prepare plans

for the bathrooms.

Public Works Director Jim Rearden responded that there were additional design charges for moving the women's bathroom.

Commissioner Burow commented that he hoped this wouldn't happen again in the future.

Motion carried 5-0.

Mayor Winters opened the meeting to Petitions and Communications.

Cable 7.

24A. Kathy Gessaman, 1006 36th Avenue NE, as Secretary/Treasurer of Cable 7, Inc., requested that information be provided at the next meeting regarding why the City did not renew the contract with the Cable 7 Board.

Community Garden, sewer repairs.

24B. Karen Grove, 1816 1st Avenue North, commented that the political sign concern was addressed to the Community Garden Committee. The signs were posted with the permission of the landowner. Ms. Grove thanked the City for sewer repairs to 1st Avenue North.

ECP.

24C. Ron Gessaman, 1006 36th Avenue NE, commented that the ECP Board voted on August 2, 2010, to end the Pilot Program by sending out a 60 day notice immediately. Mr. Gessaman also discussed a table of NorthWestern Energy, ECP and SME prices for the past seven years that was contained in the October 15 Weekly Review packet.

Pine Beetles, Dutch Elm, recession.

24E. John Hubbard, 615 7th Avenue South, inquired what to do to protect trees from Pine Beetles and Dutch Elm disease.

Park & Recreation Director Marty Basta responded that patches and sprays are the most effective protection from Pine Beetles, and that he would get information from the City Forester regarding Dutch Elm for Mr. Hubbard.

Mr. Hubbard also discussed power rate increases, recession, national news and Cable 7.

Street name change, safety inspections.

24F. Cyndi Baker, 500 Montana Avenue NW, inquired about changing the name of her street so that it would be easier to find her residence in the case of an emergency. Fire Chief McCamley explained the City goes through

great efforts through its mapping system and geo system used by dispatchers to get them to the right addresses. He extended an invitation to Ms. Baker to visit with him and do some more research.

Ms. Baker also commented that she has a business in her home. She takes issue with inspectors not knocking before entering her business when performing their annual safety inspections.

Suggested Motion:

1. Commissioner moves:

"I move that the City Commission set a public hearing on Resolution 9906 Golf Fees for November 16, 2010."

2. Mayor calls for a second, discussion, inquiries from the public, and calls the vote.

Staff Recommendation: Staff recommends that the City Commission set a public hearing on Resolution 9906 Golf Fees for November 16, 2010. Resolution 9906 would repeal Resolution 9726 and set fees for the 2011 golf season.

Background: The Golf Course Fund financial status has shown a significant improvement over the last three years. This improvement is attributable to efforts in marketing and promotions as well as an increase in the customer base which was impacted by the closure of a local golf course in 2008. FY 2010 is the first time the fund has met the Revenue Bond Covenants in 10 years. However, capital needs in the Golf Course Fund are not being met and maintenance equipment purchases are being deferred. In addition, the Golf Course Fund owes a significant debt (\$1,133,908) to the General Fund for subsidies required to balance the Golf Course Fund and to meet the Revenue Bond Covenants.

On September 26, 2010, Park and Recreation staff presented a financial report to the Golf Advisory Board including a proposed 6% increase in golf course fees. Golf fees have not been increased since FY 2008. The Board voted unanimously and recommended that the City Commission adopt the 6% increase in golf fees.

On Tuesday October 19, 2010, staff conducted a detailed presentation at the City Commission Work Session on Golf Course Fees. Financial trends, operational statistics and golf fee comparisons were presented along with the proposed 6% Golf Course Fee increase. While recognizing significant financial improvement in the Golf Course Fund, staff recommended the fee increase to provide funding for capital needs, General Fund loan and Bond payments. The

City Commission supported staff's recommended 6% Golf Fee increase at that meeting and directed staff to move forward with the recommendation.

Concurrences: On September 26, 2010, the Golf Advisory Board voted unanimously to recommend that the City Commission adopt the proposed 6% increase in golf fees. On Tuesday, October 19, 2010 following a City Commission Work session the Commission directed staff to move forward with the 6% golf fee increase.

Fiscal Impact: The 6% increase is projected to increase golf course revenues by approximately \$85,000. These funds would be used towards capital needs, maintenance equipment upgrades, as well as General Fund loan and Bond payments.

Alternatives: An alternative would be to not increase golf course fees, continue to defer equipment purchases and capital needs, and continue to subsidize the fund with General Fund revenues.

Purpose

The specifications were advertised two times in the Great Falls Tribune, placed on the City of Great Falls website, and mailed to five prospective bidders. The bids were opened on October 20, 2010 with two bidders responding, each with an alternative bid. The old unit will be used as backup to the residential fleet.

Conclusion

The bid by Tri-State Equipment meets specifications for the tandem axle truck with sideload refuse packer. Tri-State Equipment's alternative bid was for a Heil packer body. The mechanical arm requested in the bid specs (Wayne Curb Tender packer body) has a more effective history when emptying 300 gallon containers, as well as less

expensive maintenance than the belted system (Heil packer body), thus staff recommends awarding the second low bid (difference of \$445).

Fiscal Impact: The budget allocation for the purchase of one tandem axle truck with sideload refuse packer is \$230,730. Funds for this purchase are provided in the FY 2011 Sanitation Budget.

Alternatives: Reject the bids for the purchase of one new tandem axle truck with new sideload refuse packer.

Suggested Motion:

"I move that the City Commission reject the bid for the Police Department Rehabilitation Project."

2. Mayor calls for a second, discussion, inquiries from the public, and calls the vote.

Staff Recommendation: Staff recommends the City Commission reject the one bid received for the Police Department Rehabilitation Project.

Background: Approved by the City Commission in 2008, this Community Transportation Enhancement Program (CTEP) project would repair and replace deteriorating concrete parapet and concrete column caps on the Police Department building, as well as repair the deteriorating loading ramp/dock.

The project was initially approved with a construction budget of \$59,400. After an Engineer's investigation and analysis of the condition of the parapet and the appropriate treatment methods, the Engineer's estimate for construction increased to \$124,000. To fund the project at the level of the Engineer's estimate, the project would need additional CTEP and local matching funds.

The competitive bid process was followed, with a bid opening held on October 25, 2010. Only one bid was received in the amount of \$149,395.03. A summary of the bid is attached.

There are insufficient funds to award the bid, and competition was limited. Therefore, staff recommends rejection of the bid and re-bidding in early 2011.

Concurrences: Representatives from the Planning and Community Development Department, Police Department and Lacy & Ebeling Engineering, Inc. concur in the rejection of the bid and re-advertising for next spring's construction season.

Fiscal Impact: Award of this construction contract would necessitate an additional \$10,500 in city funds, and \$68,000 in CTEP funds. At this time, the additional funds do not appear to be available. Re-advertising in the spring is anticipated to result in more competitive bids.

Alternatives:

- 1) The City Commission could award the construction contract to the sole bidder, Dick Olson Construction, but would need to also identify the source of additional funds necessary for award.
- 2) The City Commission could postpone action on this item until its next meeting.

2. Mayor calls for a second, discussion, inquiries from the public, and calls for the vote.

Staff Recommendation: Approve construction contract award.

Background:

Significant Impacts

This project involves relocating the existing sewer main located in 11th Alley North from 10th Street to 11th Street to 10th Avenue North and 11th Street North. The sewer main in 11th Alley North from 11th Street to 12th Street will also be replaced with this project. Existing sewer services will be relocated to connect to the new sewer main.

Workload Impacts

City engineering staff designed the project, and will perform construction inspection and contract administration duties.

<u>Purpose</u>

During routine maintenance, the sewer main located in 11th Alley North from 10th Street to 12th Street was found to have partial collapses in several locations. This sewer main is located under an active railroad track and any excavation would cause disruptions to rail operations and incur significant costs. Relocating the sewer main to 10th Avenue North

was found to be the most cost effective option. Sewer services that currently flow to the alley will be rerouted to the street.

Project Work Scope

This project will relocate approximately 1,020 linear feet of 8-inch sewer main and install four new manholes. Seven sewer services will also be relocated with this project.

Evaluation and Selection Process

Seven bids were received and opened for this project on October 20, 2010. The bids ranged from \$152,980.00 to \$243,900.00. Shumaker Trucking & Excavating Contractors, Inc. submitted the low bid and executed all the necessary bid documents.

Conclusion

City staff recommends awarding the construction contract to Shumaker Trucking & Excavating Contractors, Inc. in the amount of \$152,980.00.

Fiscal Impact: The attached bid tabulation summarizes the bids that were received. This project will be funded through Sewer Capital Funds.

Alternatives: The City Commission could vote to deny award of the construction contract.

Suggested Motion:

"I move the City Commission approve Change Order No. 1 in the amount of \$13,237.50 for the 2010 Handicap Ramps, O. F. 1588.1, to Gregoire Construction and authorize the City Manager to execute the agreements."

2. Mayor calls for a second, discussion, inquiries from the public, and calls for the vote.

Staff Recommendation: Approve Change Order No. 1.

Background:

Significant Impacts

This change order involves the replacement of a valley gutter at 7th Avenue North and 19th Street along with two additional handicap ramp corners at the southwest and southeast corners of the same intersection. The valley gutter replacement will improve drainage in the area and reduce ice buildup that had been occurring in the winter. ADA handicap ramp improvements will be constructed on the southern portion of the intersection, completing ramps around this intersection. The northern portion of the intersection is already being replaced through this contract.

Workload Impacts

City engineering staff applied for and were awarded the grant, designed the project, and are performing construction inspection and contract administration duties. The Planning and Community Development Department administers the CDBG program and is performing grant and other administrative duties.

Purpose / Project Work Scope

Approximately eight new handicap ramp corners will be constructed with the original project including 280 linear feet of new curb and gutter, 2,150 square feet of new sidewalk for handicap ramps, 128 square feet of truncated domes, and 2,000 square feet of sod replacement. Change Order No. 1 will add a valley gutter replacement and two additional handicap ramp corners which includes 90 linear feet of new curb and gutter, 650 square feet of new sidewalk, 32 square feet of truncated domes and 300 square feet of sod replacement.

Evaluation and Selection Process

Six bids were received and opened for this project on August 25, 2010. Gregoire Construction submitted the low bid of \$32,215.00, with an additive bid item bringing the contract total to \$42,000. The City Commission awarded the contract September 7, 2010. This change order will increase the total contract value to \$55,237.50

Conclusion

City staff recommends approving Change Order No. 1 to Gregoire Construction in the amount of \$13,237.50.

Fiscal Impact:

The additional funding will come from the Street Repair and Maintenance Funds. The original project is funded by a Community Development Block Grant (CDBG).

Alternatives:

The City Commission could vote to deny Change Order No. 1.
