FIRE PREVENTION

MAJOR CAUSES OF STRUCTURE FIRES

8 fires were the result of *Combustibles too close to heat.*

8 fires were the result of *Careless Smoking.*

6 fires were the result of *Food Unattended on Stove.*

PROPERTY VALUE & LOSS

The estimated value of the structures (52) involved in fires in 2016 was \$20,949,320.

The total estimated property damage was \$2,609,792.

This equates to a loss of 12.46%.

Of the 52 structure fires, 40 fires were confined to the room or area of origin, 10 were confined to the structure itself and 2 extended beyond the structure.
