FIRE PREVENTION

MAJOR CAUSES OF STRUCTURE FIRES

16 fires were the result of *Food Unattended on Stove*.

8 fires were the result of *Careless Smoking*.

4 fires were the result of *Dirty Chimney*.

PROPERTY VALUE & LOSS

The estimated value of the structures (51) involved in fires in 2013 was \$46,865,550.

The total estimated property damage was \$279,213. ***This equates to a loss of .6%.***



Of the 51 structure fires, 29 fires were confined to the room or area of origin, 23 were confined to the structure itself and 0 extended beyond the structure.
