MAJOR CAUSES OF STRUCTURE FIRES

6 fires were the result of *Food Unattended on Stove*.
6 fires were the result of *Careless Smoking*.
6 fires were the result of *Appliances*.
6 fires were the result of *Wiring*.

PROPERTY VALUE & LOSS

The estimated value of the structures (49) involved in fires in 2014 was \$41,628,220. The total estimated property damage was \$1,467,490.

This equates to a loss of 3.53%.

Of the 49 structure fires, 40 fires were confined to the room or area of origin, 8 were confined to the structure itself and 1 extended beyond the structure.
