Old Business:

Neighborhood Watch: Julie discussed results of the Neighborhood Watch initiative at recent Sunnyside parent/teacher conferences. There were 11 new people who completed the NW application form. The council suggested they bring it up at the May meeting with Officer Gerhart.
