

**MEETING MINUTES**

**CALL TO ORDER**

Meeting was called to order at 7:02 pm. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited. A quorum was established with Ron Staley, Sue Ann Strickland and Elizabeth McBride. We were joined by Lanni Klasner.

**OLD BUSINESS**

- Planning and Community Development Q&A – Deputy Director Tom Micuda gave information about a rezoned area in the neighborhood. He also updated the council about the Buffalo Crossing property (which has active interest for a brew pub), the North 40 building (which should be opened by the years end), and the 5 on Black restaurant (which has been halted due to financial issues)

**PETITIONS AND COMMUNICATIONS**

- Cheryl Higgins asked Tom Micuda about complaints with a neighbor across from Flower Farm. Tom will be getting in touch with her with updates
- Tom also explained our complaint driven system due to case load volume

**OTHER BUSINESS**

- Council of Councils – Recycling panel talked about a community survey to gauge interest in the community members paying to recycle. The GFPD spoke about using a heat mapping system for crime areas in Great Falls using real time.
- Eric Ray from Council #5 on Madison Food Park – Eric presented a resolution that asks the City Commission to publicly evaluate the impacts of the Madison Food Park. They will present the resolution on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Tuesday of January. He asks for the other councils support and that we all stand together. Our council voted to support council #5s resolution, unanimously.
