Chair Sandra opened the meeting at 630p.m with Pledge of Allegiance.

New Business:

Steve Herrig gave an update on current P&R business. A new restroom will be installed at Lyons and Oddfellows parks. Three parks will receive irrigation upgrades. Some basketball courts will be resurfaced this summer. Public works will repair sidewalks in some parks. P&R is coordinating with the Little Libraries installation. The land swap on 52nd St. was approved and public input will be taken for what its use will be. Steve said P&R would look at the sidewalks and gopher issue at Heren Park. He cautioned that the gopher problem cannot be fully corrected until the vacant land is occupied.

The senate bills that threatened the aquatics center were tabled in committee. Steve has concerns about park safety related to the handgun bill recently passed.

Petitions and Comments: Jason Wethington brought news of researching urban chicken ordinances. Larry mentioned a head on wreck occurring near 38th and 8th Ave. N. Police have been seen patrolling for speeders.
