NEW BUSINESS

- Alluvion Health Annual Report - Alluvion Representative-Casey Schriener
 1. One third of testing for Covid in the state, runs through the Alluvion lab. 2018-19 separated from county. Serves mostly those who are challenged to get health care. Started C.I.P. (Crisis Intervention Plan), to deal with a community member crisis, beginning today they met (May 27th), bringing in various city, county and school resources to discuss and plan steps and actions. Has a mobile dental unit to deal with school age children. Has medical clinics in various schools (Great Falls, Vaughn, Belt and Cascade.) Provide mental health services and speech therapy. Would like to add in physical therapy in the future. Gregg brought up the need to care for the mental health of elderly in long term care, as the emphasis has been on the youth in the Covid pandemic. Casey responded that a mobile response unit is being discussed to help with mental health.

 1. HUD development program

 3. Lanni brought up the glitches and challenges of using the city website to access information.
 4. Chief Newton gave a presentation on the status of the department and crime stats. The 911 system is currently down. He indicated meth is major problem with heroine coming in. Chief Newton is exploring a liaison for Neighborhood Councils. Looking to bring back Neighborhood Watch, having the city police assist in getting it going and recruiting block captains to lead in neighborhoods. Looking to bring back Citizens Academy and Coffee With a Cop.
 5. Neighbor Works spoke about offering grants to Neighborhood Councils, to encourage proposals, to engage neighborhood members. Ice cream social is a common theme. Voted to do ice cream social, motion by Gregg and seconded by Sue, passed.
