NEW BUSINESS:

- Park & Rec Update Steve Herrig, Park & Rec Director. Mr. Herrig gave a powerpoint
 presentation about the New Recreation Center progress. Completion in May 2024 or
 earlier. Old Rec Center will remain city property and may continue to be used as a day care
 co-op. Other items discussed included maintenance of Heren Park walking trail, master
 plan for 10 acre park tract south of Soccer Park purchased from school district, and health of
 parks and trees.
- Animal Shelter Laramie Smovir, Volunteer Coordinator. COGF Animal Shelter focuses on dogs and cats. Issuing of dog and cat licenses. Multiple animal permits are needed for over 2 cats or 2 dogs at an address. Urban wildlife issues are handled by FWP. GFPD has animal control officers, and Cascade County Sheriff can respond to issues with dogs outside the city. Discussed volunteering opportunities at the shelter.

PETITIONS AND COMMUNICATIONS

• An attendee asked about litter on the streets. It was suggested to contact Neighborworks Great Falls about the upcoming CommUNITY Cleanup.

- Council Vacancies. Need to fill terms through end of year. Filing for election opens in April.
 - Guynn gave a description of the mission of the council membership. Volunteer elected officials, and the council is an advisory body. Membership is not a platform for addressing individual agendas with neighbors or businesses. Not a political position. Asked for nominations.
 - Guynn nominated Neil Treadray, 3816 4th Ave N. #11. Ward Seconded. Motion carried.
 - o Guynn nominated Doug Darko, 5501 5th Ave S. Ashley Seconded. Motion carried.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

• Sue Ashley provided a crime mapping update. NC4 had the least crime of all council areas. 9 incidents in month February to March 2023.
