- Downtown Safety Alliance Efforts & Library Levy Sandy Rice.
  - If levy passes, library will be open 7 days a week and bookmobile service will increase. If not, hours will be reduced to 5 days a week and some staff layoffs. Voting absentee or at polls on June 6<sup>th</sup>.
  - Spring Sale by Friends of the Great Falls Public Library starts May 11, proceeds go directly to supporting the library. Requesting book donations.
  - SCRAM program enrolling security cameras, police may ask for video. More information is on city website.
  - Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design (CPTED) efforts to make buildings less attractive to crime.
  - Summer Ambassador volunteer program looking for volunteers to take 1 to 2 twohour shifts per week and be present downtown.
- School Board Candidate Rodney Meyers. Supports the "Character Strong" program and wants to work to make that the school culture and confirm that curriculum matches that. Supports "day to day math" class and provable and repeatable science education.
