## COMMITTEE REPORTS

City Commission: no report
Police Advisory Board: The board meets 6 times per year; Motion by Jesse O'Hara to nominate Fred Rauch to continue representing our council at the meetings. Second by Lynda Sowell; passed unanimously.

Council of Councils: Large vehicle ordinance - consensus was that the current ordinance is adequate and no further action is needed at this time. The Cascade County Conservation District was also discussed. The older parts of the city are not a part of the district, but the newer parts are. Program Director Toni Neslen wants to bring in the old sections of the city to better coordinate their programs. Urban deer and turkeys were also discussed.

- Meadowlark Home Owners Association Discriminatory Clause: City Attorney James Santoro said the matter does not involve the city. As a council we can support action, but cannot initiate anything.
