Old Business:

Committee Reports:

Pearson Addition – City personnel and the Work Group have not met per Robin.

Upper/Lower River Road Drainage Problem – City personnel will provide an update to property owners at the March 6 Neighborhood Council meeting per Cherry Loney. The meeting will be specific to the U/L RR drainage problem and will not include the Pearson Addition SID. A meeting notice will be forwarded to the Tribune and Cherry will also notify residents.

Police Advisory Board – Robin reports they are moving along with relocating the Call Center, although funding is still an issue. At the last meeting an electronic data analysis program that supports policing was discussed and is being tried in various aspects of law enforcement.

Citizens Academy – Robin has been accepted. She will not be in attendance at April and May Neighborhood Council meetings as they conflict with when the Citizens Academy meets.

Council of Councils – Robin attended and gave a brief overview. She relayed the Mayor wants to hear from Councils.

New Business:

Community Leadership Institute Survey – Jennifer Reichelt, Deputy City Manger, distributed a questionnaire to gather information for the Community Leadership Institute.

Andrew Finch, Planner for the City Transportation Department, provided an update on potential improvements on parts of 13th and 26th Streets as well as 24th Ave. So. to accommodate increasingly more traffic. Improvements will be paid for with federal grant dollars.

Carl noted problems at the 1500 12th Ave. So. property are ongoing. Jennifer said she would relay the information to the enforcement division for follow up.
