Information will be gathered by a statistically significant survey, additional information will be gathered by Survey Monkey. Then analysis will be conducted. The focus of the survey will be:

What are the four most important programs and services?

What are the top four unmet needs?

GFPD Volunteers must pass a background check, be of good character and over 18 years of age. Volunteers are asked to do about 200 hours a year. Volunteers currently range in age from 18 to 78. There are many areas that volunteers assist, including junk and abandoned vehicles, monitoring inmate phone calls, assist with evidence, warrants and citizen patrol. Sheila Rice with Neighborworks provided information on their home improvement loans which they administer for the City of Great Falls and Cascade County to assist home owners with improvements.
