February 25, 2014 Council of Councils meeting: Sandra reported that due to the low number of responses to the Health Dept. Visual Preference Survey, the survey would not be a viable tool to use for planning. She also talked about the local government review which is required every ten years to determine if the voters want to elect and fund a study commission to review city and county forms of government. It will be on the June 3rd Primary election. If the voters are in favor of a study commission, it may cost up to \$125,000 for the City and \$125,000 for the County; and a five member study commission will then be established and tasked with studying the existing form of government and a report of their findings will be presented to the voters for approval or rejection no later than the 2016 general election.
