The process for the Great Falls Indoor Aquatics and Recreation Center which began in May of 2020 is about to become reality with the facility opening in Summer 2024. The facility itself will house: a lap pool, recreation pool, gymnasium, fitness area, indoor track, multi-purpose room, party room, locker rooms, concession area, offices. The facility became a reality through the efforts of the City of Great Falls and Malmstrom Air Force Base. The two partnered to acquire a \$10,000,000 federal grant and \$10,000,000 of matching money from the City of Great Falls Park District No. 1. This facility will be an exciting addition to the community for all to use.

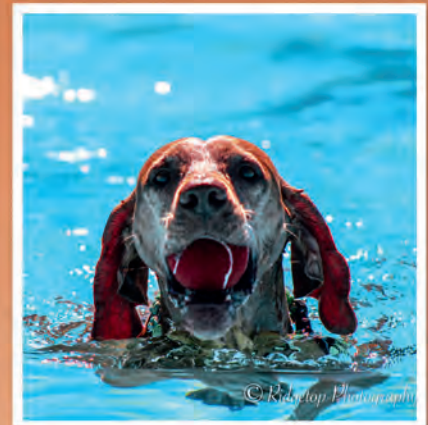
Drool In the Pool

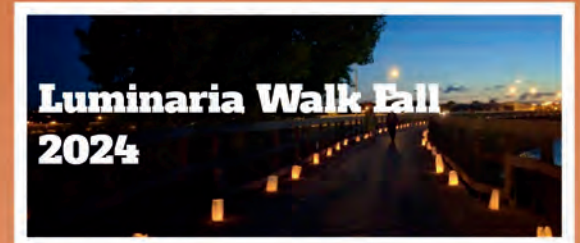
