MINUTES

Prior to the meeting, Committee members were provided a copy of the June 12, 2014 TAC meeting minutes. Mr. Finch said a correction was noted.

MOTION: That the minutes of June 12, 2014 be approved with corrections.

Vote: The motion passed unanimously.

BUSINESS ITEMS

Prior to the meeting, TAC members were provided with copies of the TAC meeting agenda. Copies of the agenda and handout materials are attached and incorporated by reference.

5A. Draft 2014-18 TIP

Mr. Finch said there were still some blanks in Table 5 of the 2014-18 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP), which have been filled in since the draft was sent to the TAC members. He said that the TIP is now adequate to move forward. Changes to the last TIP amendment include the addition of some adoption procedures and update amendment and administrative modification procedures, which the Federal Highway Administration and the Federal Transit Administration wanted to be added. Also added are the Montana Department of Transportation (MDT) funded projects, as well as projects that are nominated. He said there are no new local projects, and that the Fox Farm Road project is the current Urban funded project. He said the right-of-way acquisition is a big question on this project. MDT thinks there will be impact on the developed properties. MDT also wants to take down the vertical curves, especially at 45th Avenue South and Dick Road, which would require more right-of-way and increase the cost of the project.

Mr. Finch said the 2014-18 TIP shows a negative balance for urban funding for future years, but he said that is okay because the TIP can be amended in the future, and we can also request to borrow from the state-wide pot for urban funding. There are, however, other jurisdictions also in line to borrow funding. The TIP is fiscally constrained right now. Mr. Finch said he removed some short-term projects which have been in the TIP for a number of years but for which there is no funding. He said that, as a group, there can be discussion about what pot of monies would fund those projects if they are to be added back in. These were intersection improvement and channelization projects, which may be eligible for MACI funds.

Mr. Finch offered to answer questions about the TIP. He said he is requesting TAC to recommend approval by the Policy Coordinating Committee (PCC) and also to authorize staff to begin the 30-day public comment period. The final TIP will go to the PCC for final consideration and also go to the Planning Advisory Board.

MOTION: That the Technical Advisory Committee (TAC) approve the Draft 2014-2018 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) and recommend the Policy Coordinating Committee (PCC) approve it also, and authorize City Planning staff to begin the 30-day public comment period.

OTHER BUSINESS

Mr. Finch said the development of the Unified Planning Work Program is moving forward for the next Federal Fiscal Year. MDT would like this at the latest by September 1, and the Federal partners want a full 30-day review. He said there will probably be a special TAC meeting later in August. Carol Strizich said if the September 1 date was not reasonable, they would work with Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) to establish an alternate timeline. Mr. Finch said he would work with her to set a timeline.

There was no public comment.

ADJOURNMENT

Mr. Lyerly made a motion to adjourn seconded by Mr. Dobbs. All being in favor, the meeting adjourned at 9:47 a.m.
