**NEW BUSINESS**

**1. POLICE COMMISSION'S EXAMINATION OF APPLICANT(S): JOSHUA HARRIS FOR THE POLICE FORCE – GREAT FALLS POLICE DEPARTMENT.**

Lt. LaBard stated that the application(s) of **Joshua Harris** had been referred to the Police Commission. Pursuant to Mont. Code Ann. §7-32-4154, this meeting is an examination of the applicant as to their age, legal, mental, moral, and physical qualifications and their ability to fill the office as a member of the police force.

Lt. LaBard read the provisions of Mont. Code Ann. § 7-32-4151, that sets forth the role of the Police Commission; reviewed each item provided to the Commission members in their meeting packets; and, read the provisions of Mont. Code Ann. § 7-32-303, qualifications of law enforcement officers. He explained that this meeting is for the Police Commission to review the documentation, conduct the examination of each applicant, and make a determination as to whether each applicant meets the qualifications of a law enforcement officer.

He read the provisions of Mont. Code Ann. § 2-3-203(3). He asked the applicant's position with regard to their right to privacy. **Applicant(s) Joshua Harris asserted his right to privacy.**

Lt. LaBard noted that there is substantial value in having the examination confidential to have a frank and open discussion with the applicants and to gain an accurate view of qualifications to determine their ability to fill the office as a member of the police force. Lt. LaBard determined that each applicant(s) individual privacy clearly exceeded the merits of public disclosure, and closed the meeting for the Commission to conduct each applicant(s) examination in executive session.

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At **9:08 AM** members of the Commission and Lt. LaBard, met in closed executive session in the City Commission Chambers for the purpose of the Commission conducting the examination of applicant(s), **Joshua Harris**.

**Both Commissioners signed the certificate(s) authorizing Joshua Harris to become a member(s) of the Great Falls Police Department.**
