NEW BUSINESS

1. POLICE COMMISSION'S EXAMINATION OF APPLICANT(S): CARLOS MAGANA, CAMERON WATSON, REMINGTON FRICK, AND BRADEN HIRST FOR THE POLICE FORCE – GREAT FALLS POLICE DEPARTMENT.

Lt. LaBard stated that the application(s) of Carlos Magaña, Cameron Watson, Remington Frick, and Braden Hirst had been referred to the Police Commission. Pursuant to Mont. Code Ann. §7-32-4154, this meeting is an examination of the applicant as to their age, legal, mental, moral, and physical qualifications and their ability to fill the office as a member of the police force.

Lt. LaBard read the provisions of Mont. Code Ann. § 7-32-4151, that sets forth the role of the Police Commission; reviewed each item provided to the Commission members in their meeting packets; and, read the provisions of Mont. Code Ann. § 7-32-303, qualifications of law enforcement officers. He explained that this meeting is for the Police Commission to review the documentation, conduct the examination of each applicant, and make a determination as to whether each applicant meets the qualifications of a law enforcement officer.





Both Commissioners signed the certificate(s) authorizing Carlos Magaña, Cameron Watson, Remington Frick, and Braden Hirst to become a member(s) of the Great Falls Police Department.
